Dear Friends,

As the time for my retirement draws closer, I find myself reflecting on the last 20 years of ordained ministry in the Church of England. Receiving a calling to serve the Church in my mid 30s, little did I know what was to come: where Alistair and I would live, and what we would do.

It began in the Diocese of Chelmsford, serving as Curate at Tiptree, (where the jam comes from). In Essex I enjoyed radio work for BBC Essex – eventually! I was so nervous when I started that Alistair had to drive me to the studio several times, but I then got used to it. Live radio is very exciting and challenging. Over the years there have been sad moments and joyous ones, hilarious and downright embarrassing too. One Sunday at Tiptree, the elastic on my petticoat went as I was preparing Holy Communion, and the aforesaid garment ended up on the floor at my feet. Fortunately only one person noticed. I suspect that this may be what I am remembered for, not my faith or prayers!

If the success of Christian ministry is to be judged by the number of toilets and kitchenettes installed in mediaeval buildings, then I have done quite well, having installed 3 in all. In my first post, a Benefice of 4 parishes in a rural area of north Essex, I had to deal with major re-wiring, lead theft, and renovated all 4 organs too. Next came a move to Lincoln Diocese just on the edge of the fens. I loved the flat land and distant horizons. The Priory Church at Deeping St James is a vast Church with a soaring tower seen from miles around. I realise that old age is creeping up on me, because I have been on every Church roof where I have ministered – but not on Sibbertoft or Welford! I even crawled inside the cavernous roof at Deeping St James looking for woodworm.

Visiting our grandchildren and family in Derbyshire from Essex, we used to turn off junction 1 on the A14 and have a meal at the Wharf, then join the M1 at Lutterworth. Little did I realise that I would end up as the Vicar here in Welford, but that was God's plan.

There have been very sad and tragic moments working with bereaved families. There has been a lot of fun working with children and Young People, not least of all Messy Church in Welford and the Good Friday Roadshow. I must have taken hundreds of school Assemblies, (now called Collective Worship). There have been many memorable weddings too, especially one some years ago, where my cat wandered into the Church and posed in all the photos afterwards, enjoying the attention. When I started in 1998, there was no email, but a mound of post on the doorstep each day. Even as late as 2010 I knew just a few elderly clergy who had no computer, resisting technological change. Fortunately Alistair, being a railway engineer was very up to date with technology. He has designed 3 web sites for Churches, and assisted with many practical issues. He has also worked hard supporting local bell ringers wherever we have lived. I am grateful for his support, especially the delicious Sunday Lunch he cooks every week ready for me when I get back home from the Sunday morning services.

Other things I will miss – the delight of walking into Church on Easter morning with the scent and sight of the flowers after Lent; the Harvest Services and Suppers with my congregations, delicious cakes after Evensong, Sunday Teas, Quiz nights and Pancake Parties, Fetes and Film Shows.

My family complain that I am picking up a slight twang of a northern accent, so here in the East Midlands you are to be congratulated in making me a local. We are not moving far away, just to Market Harborough, and I am sure that I will eventually be providing holiday cover locally. Later this year I have been invited to assist in leading two Retreats, one in Chelmsford, the other in Ely. I didn't expect these invitations, so there is still God's work to be done, and something new just around the corner.

Thank you all for your support and kindness. We have had a happy 5 years together. With all good wishes, and prayers for the future,

A son of Welford became a newspaper proprietor and Mayor of Leicester

Thanks go to Derek Eastwood for sending this article he found when reading "From Tollgate to Tramshed" – the history of London Road, Leicester 1860 -1920 published in 1999 by Helen Boynton and Derek Seaton.

Francis Hewitt was born in Welford on the 1st of May 1832.

In 1836 the Leicester Mercury newspaper was established, and later on Hewitt joined it as a journalist. Further on in time he set up as a bookseller and stationer in Granby St. Leicester. When the historian James Thompson proprietor of the "Leicester Daily Mercury" and the "Leicester Chronicle & the Leicestershire Mercury died in 1877 Francis Hewitt acquired the newspapers for £1500. A few years later he purchased the "Leicester Daily Post" In 1859 he married Miss Catherine Russell of Leicester; in 1871 he married again To Miss Elizabeth Cook of King's Lynn. That same year he entered politics as a Liberal Councillor for North Saint Margaret's Ward Leicester, and in 1882became Mayor of Leicester. In that year a large semi-detached residence was built on London Road in the city, where Fran

In that year a large semi-detached residence was built on London Road in the city, where Francis and Elizabeth came to live. The house became known as "Southernhay" after a suburb of Exeter they knew well.

On 25th October 1897 Francis Hewitt died at his Country home in Hunstanton and was buried in Old Hunstanton churchyard. Elizabeth continued to live at "Southernhay" dying in 1902, and is buried beside her husband in Old Hunstanton.

Ernie Badger – Uncle to Richard (Dickie) Mathers who played for Welford

Unknown (TR) - Thought to come from one of the Kilworths to play for Welford as they had no team.

Steve Thomas – One of 4 boys who all played for Welford at various times. Both Don and Bill played in goal. Don playing well into the 60's

George Voss – Brother to Ted and lived on the corner of Newlands and Northampton Road.

Geoff McAllister – Lived in the back street opposite the Crescent. He grew his own pipe tobacco in the allotment and was born in the Benthams house opposite the reservoir.

Mick Brown – Brother to Ann Barber who lived with his brother Dick on Northampton Road and later in Market Harborough where he worked for the Town and County Council.

Bill Thomas – Lived in North Kilworth and his son, Jeff also played for Welford

Charlie Miller – Uncle to Mandy Thompson and brother to Glad Mercer and lived in the family home on the corner of Newlands and West End.

John Hollis – Born in the house opposite the Village Hall. Lost an eye whilst threshing with the Vaughans but still played football and cricket as well as shooting. Played with 2 brothers for Welford. Worked for Cess Walton

John Barber – Cousin to Brian Barber and lived on Newlands Road. His father was Cess Barber.

Ted Voss – Lived on the corner of Westfield Crescent. His son Ian also played for Welford. Ted later became a referee and cricket umpire.

Unknown (BR) - Thought to have lodged at Mrs Clay's in West End (in Mr & Mrs Harrison's). Possibly Mr Patterson.

Colin Grant – Brother of Gordon, Norman and Doreen Beck. Doreen still lives in the family home on Northampton Road. All 3 boys played for Welford and this photograph was given to the Sports Field by Doreen Beck, nee Grant.

Thank you....

On the 2nd of January at 0912hrs, life thought it would deal me yet another lesson As I tripped on the 2nd stair down from the top I was a goner! I tumbled down with legs and arms waving all over the place, at one point I briefly glimpsed the sole of my right foot level with my right shoulder I remember thinking – I must book a pedicure! However, when I landed at the bottom with my foot pointing right and my fibula sticking out to the left, a pedicure was the least of my worries. I laid there trying to establish exactly what hurt when Harry, my 11-year-old son asked me if I was conscious and breathing, he was already on the phone to the ambulance! Within minutes of landing my mum (Jane Martin) flew through the door as Thomas, my other 11year old son had done an SOS call to nanny! Within minutes of my mum arriving my sister (Victoria Martin-Deacon) also flew through the door. It's at moments like this (as if I didn't already know) that I once again thanked god for such an amazing family, something I have done a lot of over the last few weeks!

As it was the school holidays we were enjoying the last few days of relaxing in the mornings with nothing to rush for so I was still in my PJ's! I was aware an ambulance was on its way and although I've not nursed for a few years I was almost certain my ankle was broken as the bone poking out was giving it away slightly! Therefore, I knew I would be going into hospital and there was absolutely no way I was going in my PJ's having not washed and dressed!! So, mum and Vic were tasked with the job of operation baby wipe wash and getting me dressed around a compound fracture ASAP! Fortunately, as I lifted my foot to readjust my position the dislocation popped back in which made putting trousers on a whole lot easier (you have to scrap the barrel for positives at times like this!) finally I was dressed and presentable (albeit with Neanderthal man hairy legs!) ready for the ambulance, which I have to say arrived very promptly. However, after enduring the pain of putting trousers on, the first thing the paramedic did was cut them off! Unfortunately, the absolutely drop dead gorgeous paramedic overlooked my bulbous ankle and commented on my 'winter coat' (hairy legs!) Dying inside I had to think on my feet (well foot) and I told him I was just on my way to my waxing appointment when I tripped and fell down the stairs! I then had to endure the total embarrassment of being stretchered out of my house with the hairs on my legs waving in the wind, as I was carted off to Kettering. Just as a note of interest there are a total of 137 potholes between here and Kettering (76 of which are down Newlands road!) I know for a fact as I counted (and felt) every single one!

Of course, it was the 2nd of January and the country was in the midst of a flu epidemic so A&E was heaving, at one point there wasn't a single ambulance left on the road in Northamptonshire as they were all grounded in A&E departments, so I had a very long wait on a trolley in the corridor. It was at this point as I was in a queue on my trolley the shock of what had happened was sinking in. I am a foster carer and currently have two children in placement and have two children of my own so I look after four children altogether. The youngest being 9 months...... How the hell was I going to be able to do this? It would have broken me completely to lose my placements, I am extremely independent and run my house/life by myself. Having a very undignified cry to myself in the corridor of A&E I wandered why this had to happen to me, I had left my mum and sister with everything.

Sure enough an x-ray confirmed I had snapped my fibula and dislocated my tibia, but the nature of the break meant an operation to have pins and plates.... By this time my mum had arrived just in time to hold my hand whilst I went to the plaster room to have my leg pulled and plastered (I apologise for the holes in your hand mum from my nails!) I would rather have a 20lb baby then ever have this done again!!

As a foster carer, you have two unannounced visits a year from your supervising social worker so they can just check everything is how you say it is! And yes, this morning shortly after the ambulance left with me, my social worker arrived at my house for an unannounced visit! However, my mum, sister and brother in law (the A team) had everything smoothly under control, impressing my social worker so much that she could see I had more than enough help and there were no concerns regarding the children! Mum told me about the visit when she arrived in A&E but she also said that I did not have to worry about my placements and that between us all everything would be ok (this triggered yet another undignified cry in A&E!)

You couldn't have been more right mum, and that's the purpose of writing this... Mum, Dad, Vic, Andy, Sue, Harry, Thomas, Edward, Daniel and Jack I can't ever thank you all enough. I am so privileged to call you MY family. You are all so amazing and make me so proud. Mum and Vic, you have prevented stable foster placements from being disrupted, you picked up exactly where I left off and ran everything seamlessly, not only looking after all the children but nursing me also (the worst patient in the world!) you've had uncomfortable nights on my sofa, you've helped with night feeds, you've dealt with tantrums, you've wiped away tears and you've comforted the boys when they too were very worried and anxious about me, you've also clocked up mileage running my children here there and everywhere to ensure their little lives were not at all disrupted (also running me to and fro fracture clinic!) Dad you too have also driven round the county ensuring the boys continue on their football quest never missing any training or a single match, not only enabling the boys to continue with football but impressing the coaches so much that they are now going on tour to Holland with West Bromwich Albion football academy!!

This has also made me realise what a lovely village I live in and what amazing people I have around me. I have to thank Alan and Luke Mercer and Kate Jeffrey for the loan of the most awesome wheelchair that allowed me to actually leave the house and get around to the school to pick up Edward, without this I would have been totally housebound and gone completely mad. Also, Mandy Cant for the loan of the shower seat without which washing would have been impossible! Also Jess Cant and Grandma for the delicious lemon cake! And Sheila Scullion for the shopping run! Also, I need to thank all the well-wishers and the get well soon cards I received.

Now I am back on two feet and the whole hideous incident is starting to feel like a distant memory thank goodness. I am minus my hairy legs but plus 7 very heavy screws and an even heavier plate, about a stone in weight to be precise, or at least that's what I'm saying (the extra weight has nothing to do with the amount of chocolate I ate whilst I was feeling very sorry for myself crawling around on my hands and knees!)

So once again thank you family for everything, I love you to infinity and beyond and back again Louise xxxx

Husbands Bosworth Medical Centre Update

The partners are pleased to report that the new medical centre building at 1, Marsh Drive is complete with only a few snagging issues to undertake.

We are only waiting for the installation of the N3 connection which is the secure NHS network that will provide the necessary IT links enabling all patients clinical records to be accessible to the clinician. The work may take up to a further month to be completed. This is frustrating for us as we, like you are eager to relocate into our lovely new building.

Once we have a date we will be spreading the news via the local media and posters and leaflets, and in June we hope to have an open day to coincide with the village fete.

Welford Parish Precept

In answer to parishioners queries on the increased community charge for the year, Yvonne Dean WPC responds "when we set the precept, it was to bring the Parish into line with an average for countryside parishes which we have been out of step with. Statistics supplied by the government show for Shire districts an average of £49.69 for band D — we paid £39.62 previously so the increase is approximately £10 for the year. The Parish will have to fund more this year but next year we hope it could reduce as we gain the extra income from the new development. It is also worth pointing out that an increase of 2% per annum using compound interest takes the schedule D rate of £37.4 in 2014 to £47.55 after 4 years and five years would be £51.88 so we are actually below 2% p.a. This is why we are out of step with the national average."

Nigel Brotherton, chairman adds:

"We have made provision to support extra direct work in the village and a Community Bus with other villages plus the additional costs we had to pay re the Neighbourhood Plan.

On Council Tax Band C it is less than £1 a week for all Parish services including grass cutting, street lighting, Churchyard maintenance, the playing field and play area and the Pocket Park, including a rebuilt bridge this year."

and Martin Gorrod WPC points out:

"The Parish Council will need to fill in more for a lack of funding from County." Although from last year, this piece highlighted the need for Parish Councils to step into the gap left from reduced funding from county:

"Parish Councillors work voluntarily, and, as you say, often absorb certain costs encountered in the undertaking of the position of a parish councillor. (Printing and phone calls for example). We always welcome parishioners to attend our meetings to see things at first hand."

JUNIOR CRICKET 2018 season more new junior players needed!



Our season opens this year (subject to the weather!) on Thursday April the 19th with a friendly U11/U13 match against Willoughby CC. League matches then start the first week of May with games for the U11's (8 -a-side 16 overs) and the U13's & U15's (both 11-a-side 20 overs) against various other local teams in and around Rugby and continue most weeks until mid July. U13's play on a Tuesday evening with U11's & U15's on a Thursday evening.

As in previous seasons, this is a joint initiative between Welford & Yelvertoft Cricket Clubs with the continued intention to use the facilities at both the Welford Sportsfield and the Yelvertoft Playing Fields. One third of the participating Junior Players come from each area, with the remaining third coming from other villages and Rugby itself. In 2017, close to 45 youngsters took part over the 4 age groups (Inc Kwik Cricket)so please continue to support this joint initiative!!

We are also lucky in having 4 x ECB qualified and DBS cleared cricket coaches to help our young players develop, and have seen our first junior girl and boy now progressing on to play at both NCCC District Trials and County Level.

All 3 teams need some more players, so if you have lads or lasses who would like to take part (previous experience not needed), or know of other juniors in nearby villages/towns who are not already committed to other teams and who would like to play, then please point them in our direction! 



Nature Notes

Spring is doing it's best to spring. Some days are glorious. I even mowed the lawn with a high setting to tidy up the view. the spring flowers are a bit confused. Daffodils and tulips and crocuses and scylla and grape hyacinths are all flowering at the same time, but they keep getting set back by the beast from the east and frost and snow. We seem to have had more than our share this winter with four coverings of the white stuff, and lots of drifting. One drift by the back hedge was as tall as me, and the road to Husbands Bosworth was quite dramatic for a few days, and the road by the Gliding Club took a long time to clear. Finally there don't seem to be any more little pockets of snow waiting for some more to take them away, as the old saving goes, though the forecasters still mention the possibility of even more inconvenience.

The fields are full of lambs. Some of the earlier ones had a wet and chilly introduction to the great outdoors, but they are growing well and chasing each other and jumping with the sheer joy of using their muscles. They are such a pleasure to watch. The grass is growing again, so the land is greening over, and the buds are appearing on the trees and hedges with the promise of leaves very soon. We have planted our seeds for the summer in the greenhouse much later than usual, but hopefully they will germinate quickly and catch up in time for us to have flowers and vegetables in due course. Easter is so early and the ground is still so wet and cold that we shan't be planting out potatoes on Good Friday, but I am trying an experiment that Ted Butlin recommended, and growing new potatoes in the big pots in the greenhouse that I use for tomatoes. They should be a real early treat, and the tomatoes can go in afterwards. I'll let you know how they work out.

So despite the wind, rain, frost and snow, the daffodils are flowering to cheer us and the rest of nature shows many signs of following suit.
