Notes from Welford Parish Council

- At the Parish Council meeting on the 24th October, the Council agreed to install more LED lights in the village. This will not only enhance our green profile, it will save money on the street lighting bill that the Parish Council is required to pay.
- Uno buses have taken over the service from Centrebus until the end of March 2020. There are no indications as yet as to what may happen beyond that date
- You will have seen Gigaclear in the village installing cabling for fibre broadband to the home as part of the Superfast Northamptonshire programme.
- Gigaclear will not be installing their cabling in the Millers Road/Roundhouse Close area as these roads have not as yet been adopted.
- As roads and verges will be dug up to provide this infrastructure Gigaclear has assured the Council it will make good the surfaces within 6 months of the work being done.
- You may have noticed an improved service in the grass cutting in the village. The Parish Council entered into a three year contract with R & G Grounds Maintenance at the beginning of the year and the improvement to the verges and fields has been noticeable.
- Repairs have been arranged for the bench on the corner of Westfield Crescent, these are of course weather dependant.

Christmas Waste Collection

- Collections will continue to take place as usual over the Christmas and New Year period, except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day
- If your collection is due on Boxing Day (Thursday, 26 December) it will instead take place on Sunday, 29 December.
- Garden waste collections for those subscribed to the service there will be a short break in collections during w/c 23 December so that crews can focus on the extra seasonal recycling.
- Waste bins your black bin will continue to be collected as normal on its three-weekly cycle. Please make sure you recycle as much as possible as side waste and bins with raised lids will not be collected.
- Recycling Your blue recycling bin will continue to be collected as usual over Christmas and New Year. There will be an extra collection for all households during week beginning 23 December. Don't forget that a range of festive items can be recycled, including foil-free Christmas cards and wrapping paper, sweet tins and drinks bottles.
- Christmas trees Households can put their real Christmas trees in their garden waste bin or alternatively place them alongside their bins on the usual day of collection week beginning 6 January. There are no communal collection points for real Christmas trees. You can also take trees to the local household waste recycling centre – find your nearest at www.daventrydc.gov.uk/recycling
- Check your collections calendar You can check your bin collection dates on the calendar delivered to you in June, or by searching your postcode on our website at www.daventrydc.gov.uk You can also check your collection day and set up alerts on your mobile by downloading the free Daventry District Council app from the Apple or Google Play stores

WILDLIFE DIARIES

It may seem that in winter there is not much wildlife to see, but it's still there, trying to keep warm and fed and expending as little energy as possible.

Here are four easy ways to help:

FEED THE BIRDS

In 1987 only 18 species of birds were recorded feeding on supplementary food in our gardens. Today, that figure is over 360 species and our gardens proving a vital part of any conservation efforts.



If you have a pond, try to keep at least a small area ice-free. Toxic gases can build up under ice affecting male frogs that hibernate in the bottom. Place a warmed saucepan gently on the ice to melt it, or better still float an old tennis ball on top to prevent ice forming in the first place.

HIBERNATING HEDGEHOGS, MICE, TOADS, etc.

Check any log or leaf piles before starting bonfires - and if you do find any hibernating creatures, just gently cover them over again and try not to disturb until well into spring.

FRESH WATER

Many birds and animals will be grateful for a drink of fresh water, especially in icy cold conditions.

BUG HOTEL WORKSHOP

Much fun was had transforming unlikely piles of twigs, bark, pine cones and seedheads into all manner of bug hotels. One even had three storeys! Serious side of this was to provide dry nooks and crannies for insects to nestle into for the winter. We learned how solitary wasps, bees, ladybirds, lacewings, earwigs and woodlice were all likely to check in.

WHEN OUT & ABOUT

This is the time of year when it is easy to spot footprints - especially of mammals in the snow or mud. There are lots of identification diagrams online - and do let me know when, where and what you spot.



In previous years, the Welford Open has been run in heat so intense, it would suck the dye from your shirt. This year, the July event is pushed back to wet October because of a player drought in the summer. A downpour stops on cue for the tee off. But by the time of the prizegiving, dusk is gathering and high winds surround the lonely clubhouse.

The mood is subdued. Players have struggled in the quagmire. It is hard to connect with a 1.7-inch ball without hitting the 4,000-mile-round soggy pudding underneath.

Organiser John Nicholas has had a stressful day, thanks to no-shows, late arrivals and some fool failing to put out a pin marker. Now he reminds us that this Welford Open could be the last at Cold Ashby, which like many golf courses is struggling to survive. We await the results. Barry Mitchell is crowned Open winner and best Welfordian with a steady 37pts. But at the other end of the prize board, John tells us the aptlynamed Roy Hacker has done a runner. Proceedings complete, we climb the long and winding road home. The club is not dead yet. Members are trying to save it from the liquidators. 
VISUALise

At the end of October a programme of major repairs began on the A14 between the M1/M6 junction and junction 2 of the A14 at Kelmarsh. This will go through to the end of December and affect both eastbound and westbound overnight traffic.

WAG had a number of meetings with the contractors and Highways England and was assured that junction 1 would be closed throughout the works, so discouraging vehicles using the inevitable cut around rather than the longer, but safer, official diversion route. All the plans were in place and communicated correctly, however the first night was a total disaster for us as hundreds of vehicles, mainly HGV's, sped through the village throughout the night and there were many complaints of disruption and lost sleep.

The contractors were full of apologies and identified that their ground crews and traffic management colleagues had not implemented the full closure nor set out the signage that had been agreed. After a few further nights of low level problems, the remaining period of the eastbound closures has been virtually trouble free. As I write this, the eastbound works are about to conclude and the westbound is due to begin, which tends to give us very few problems.

We will keep posting the contractor's updates on our Facebook page for the remainder of the works.

Shirley Vials 1934-2019



Mum was born in Welford on July28th, 1934; the first child of Alf Goodfellow, a council roadman, and Beatrice, who prior to her marriage had been in service in one of the local big houses. At the time they lived at number 6 Bank Houses on West St; later moving to a council house at 53 West St. Mum attended the village school, the local Church and the Brownies, along with her brother Robin, who was 2 years her junior.

In 1958 Mum moved to Market Harborough after marrying Lawson Vials, from East Farndon. She was however, a regular face in the village, visiting my Grandmother, Beatrice, until she died in 1978.

Mum always spoke with great affection of growing up in the village. She would often recall events from her childhood; taking the Sunday roast up the street to the baker's to cook in his oven for a small fee; walks along the canal; her father helping to carry coffins by handcart up to the cemetery; collecting rosehips as part of a campaign to make rosehip syrup for children during the war. A special memory for Mum, was when she and Robin joined Jean Tyrrell and her family, to watch the coverage of the Coronation in 1953 on their television.

Children featured a lot in Mum's memories. She would tell me of friends from school; of evacuees taken into their home during the war, and of foster babies that Beatrice cared for.

I myself, remember visiting my Grandma – going on the bus from Market Harborough with "Snowy" White and Binny. Beatrice would take us up West St and through Butcher's Lane (?) to the High St. There we would visit Gardener's shop to buy cold meat and beef paste for lunch. We would then go to see Aunty Betty and Aunty Grace at the Post Office. I believe they were cousins of some sort of Alf Goodfellow, my grandfather. Polly the parrot was a great attraction there; I remember the tall counter that had been pecked away at.

We also enjoyed the Church fete at the vicarage; seeing the steam engine owned by Mr Vaughn, and watching the Hunt gather near the Church. One of my favourite memories is of Grandma's milkman (Roy Woodford?) occasionally giving me a brown egg, which were less common then, from the back of his van.

In recent years Mum was always delighted whenever we met anyone from the village in town. She was also happy whenever she received a copy of the Welford Bugle which kept her in touch with the village. These things would spark memories, which Mum would talk of happily for the rest of the day.

Sadly, Mum died on September 7th, 2019. She died peacefully in Northampton Hospital, after suffering from a stroke.

Rita Lilian Rielly 1932-2019



Rita was a person known to many people in and around Welford. Some of us have a lot of memories of Rita and the life she led being born in Welford and never leaving the village to live anywhere else.

Rita was born the first daughter of Alf & Lilian in the high street in Welford; Rita had an elder brother Maurice, a younger brother Rodney & a younger sister Pat.

Rita went to Welford School from where she joined the Brownies & later on the Girl Guides. Rita also joined the church choir, where she thoroughly enjoyed singing. Rita enjoyed singing that much she went on to join the chorus & performed with the W.A.D.S. in the pantomime called the Queen of Hearts in the late 40's.

Rita left school at the age of 14 & went to work in a shoe factory as her first job.

Rita met her future husband Tom at a local dance. Tom was in the R.A.F. stationed at Husbands Bosworth airfield. They married in April 1950 & went on to have 5 children Lynne, Rita, Stephen, Helen & Andrew. They were very proud of their family which always came first. Their first home was in High Street later moving into Westfield Crescent where they remained for the rest of their happy married lives.

In 1961 tragedy struck when Stephen their eldest son died from an asthma attack which was heart-breaking & devastating for the whole family.

Tom & Rita loved music supporting Guilsborough School Band with fund raising events and concerts. They also loved to dance and regularly danced to the likes of the Syd Lawrence Orchestra who played music from Glen Miller. They even enjoyed barn dancing.

Tom & Rita were founder members of the Bowls club but sadly Tom's membership was brief as he suddenly became very ill and sadly died in January 1993.

Nature Notes

Autumn is over, and it is now officially meteorological winter, and we have had some frost to prove it. What an autumn it was, the wettest many can remember and the consequences will be with us for some time even if we were not affected by those awful floods. Farmers have been having real difficulty in getting fields cultivated and crops sown, and where they did get some seed in before the rain came, it has rotted instead of germinating and will have to be sown again in the spring. This has cost a lot of time and money and may well result in shortages come harvest time. It is very worrying.

There was a conclusion to the horrible sheep stealing that I talked about last time. The culprits were caught after taking and butchering animals from Welford, and while that is a cause for rejoicing, it was a great shame that the animals they took were kept as pets and never meant for meat, so their spoils would have been worthless on the market and the owner was distraught as she had kept the animals for years.

The pasture fields are a morass. Every hoof print goes in several inches and fills with water, and gateways are a nightmare even in good tall wellies. It is also quite hard to keep upright. We have to remember that a few weeks ago we were desperate for rain, but enough is enough.

On the home front I've been planting out wallflowers, which have established well in these conditions, and I've also planted lots of bulbs in anticipation of spring. It has been fairly warm until recently so some bulbs are already showing, and there was a report in a newspaper of a snowdrop actually in flower, so the old question 'When winter comes can spring be far behind?' is proving true once again, but before that we have the shortest day and Christmas to look forward to.

Welford pocket park

As many Welford residents know, the land for the Pocket Park (PP) is owned by Northamptonshire County Council and leased to Welford Parish Council. The planting and maintenance is supported by the Friends of Welford Pocket Park (FWPP).

Over the 20 years or so of its existence PP has always been a valuable village amenity and is a tribute to all the people who have been involved over those years.

PP provides a green corridor between the north end of the village and the Wharf and Marina. It is much used by villagers and marina residents; walkers; and canal boat visitors from as far afield as the USA, Australia and New Zealand.

Just like a garden or allotment, in order to keep PP 'in good shape' there is always planting or maintenance work to be done as well as the occasional major development project.

This past year has seen the pond dredged, with gratefully received support from Froglife – a wildlife charity; the hedge layed, thanks to grants from Daventry District Council and our own Parish Council; and the installation of two new bird boxes.

PP has also become associated with the Biodiversity Initiative promoted by Helen Dyson and we have hosted a very successful 'pond dipping' event. It is very much in next year's plan of things for PP to become the site for the Welford 'boutique bug hotel'!!
