The first results from the Speed indicator device (SID) installed at various locations around the village are available. 5 locations around the village have been selected and monitored. The SID has been funded by Welford Parish Council, County Councillor Cecile Irving-Swift, Welford Action Group and Northamptonshire Highways. You'll recognise the device from the speed number and hopefully smiley face.

In more traffic related news, between 14 April and 21 April if you drove along High Street you were part of a CCTV traffic survey showing what traffic drove along the road between 7AM and 7PM each day. Here are some highlights from the data.

Average hourly vehicle count:

150: Cars 35: Vans 10: HGVs 1: Transporter 1: Farm vehicle 1: Bus A total of 16,753 vehicles were recorded—76% of which were cars.

2.6 times more large vehicles (everything excluding cars) use the road in the week than at week ends.

This rose to almost 7 times higher for HGVs and an astonishing 19 times higher for car transporters (presumably all when I am driving the other way...)

The busiest times for large vehicles were 8-11 in the morning and 3-4 in the afternoon. Farm Traffic and Car Transporters peaked slightly later in the day at 4-5PM

Village History Project - Jane and George Cottrell - 2016

George and I came to Welford when we got married in 1979, as Kath Leebrook (with whom I played squash) told us a house in West Street was up for sale. We bought it for £6,500!

We moved into number 15 (now a part of Jan Blaney's house) and so began village life. George joined the cricket club, playing at Glebe Farm (where you had to be careful picking up balls in the outfield!) and I joined the tennis club and the W.I.

We lived between two shops and soon got to know people going back and forth. There was a choice of two pubs, the Swan and the Shoulder Of Mutton, and two restaurants, the Wharf and The Elizabethan. We lived directly opposite the village hall and soon got to know Stu Newton well from the Saturday night discos!

In 1981 George Junior (now Trevv) arrived, signalled by the blue sock hung up in the front window! The small two up, two down terraced house became too small and we were delighted to be lucky enough to sell within the two weeks we were given, to get first option on our house in the High Street.

We moved in July 1982 and lived in two rooms, having to rewire, put in central heating and a damp proof course. The single glazed sash windows rattled and the wind whistled through for another five years before we were able to carry out further improvements.

Hilary Downing moved in next door and soon in 1986 she had Emma. Later the same year we had William, and then many happy years as neighbours, with 'Grandma's leap' between our front garden wall and a 'Secret Garden' door between the back wall, so the children could play together.

We had many wonderful baby sitters over the years, beginning with Duncan Watson and then Nicola and Mark Barber, Kate Horner, Manda and Stu Nicholas, Matty and Nicola Johnson and Rebecca Lane now Barraclough. Many thanks to you all!

The children went to Mrs Allen's at Sulby and enjoyed the summer play schemes, cubs, scouts, and the junior football and hockey when the Sportsfield opened in 1990. I joined the hockey and rounders clubs and George became part of the cooking team at the Shoulder Of Mutton BBQ's! Over the years he has served behind the bars of all four pubs! And was DJ for the infamous New Year's Eve parties at the Shoulder.

George (Trevv) worked at the Wharf for 9 years, living next door, and has played for the mixed hockey team probably for 20 years!! Will has lived in West Street, next door at Number 36, and after ten years at Kilworth House Theatre is currently touring with 'Thriller Live' as a sound engineer.

George (senior) used to be away a lot in the winter, in Chamrousse in France and then Fiesch in Switzerland, before working at Cold Ashby Golf Club for over ten years and finally Argos at Magna Park. I have worked at Kibworth High School for over 40 years, but am retiring this summer.

After he retired, George looked after the garden for Barbara and James Corbett at Salford House for ten years. When he stopped working at Cold Ashby he took up golf, and organized the Elizabethan team in the pub league and trips to Portugal and Toft in Lincolnshire. Now retired from gardening (apart from our own garden) and golf, he has taken up the ukulele, and on a warm day can be heard playing in the garden.

I have bought a summer house and taken up crafting. I am still playing hockey and tennis, although not in the village now, and am treasurer of the rounder's club. Over the last two years, I have enjoyed singing with the ladies in the Village Vocals.

Welford has given us a wonderful family life and we now particularly enjoy supporting the Sportsfield or church in their quizzes and fundraising activities. George's golf 'swindle' is still going strong and we hope to be active villagers for many years to come.

Sheep worrying

I live in a house in Westfield Crescent that backs onto a farm (probably like most people in Welford), where there have been lots of adorable lambs & sheep, however last month, as several lambs were right up near my back fence, I witnessed a dog walker with at least 2 Labradors off lead, the dogs were running all over the field and clearly frightening the lambs & sheep. This is not the first time I have seen dog walkers in the fields with the sheep & lambs with their dogs off lead.

My question is, how is this acceptable when recently in Chichester 116 sheep were killed either by dogs or the shock of being attacked? (http://www.itv.com/news/meridian/2016-03-08/116-sheep-killed-in-uks-worst-attack/)

When speaking to someone else about this yesterday I was reminded of this:

"Walkers with dogs should take particular care when crossing fields where animals are being grazed. Section 1 of the Dogs (Protection of Livestock) Act 1953 makes it an offence for a dog to be at large, 'that is to say not on a lead or otherwise under close control', in a field or enclosure containing sheep.

It's also an offence for dogs to attack or chase livestock and farmers are allowed to shoot dogs that are worrying, or are about to worry, farm animals. This is set out in section 9 of the Animals Act 1971, which also states that the farmer isn't liable to compensate the dog's owner in such circumstances." (Ramblers.org.uk)

Please could dog walkers take extra care around livestock & keep their dogs on leads if possible!


Welford Church Fete - a plea!


The Management committee would like to thank all those who have supported this new Big Screen venture. We also look forward to seeing some new faces.


John Edward Oliver

John moved to Welford in 1951 his wife, Marjorie (who he married in 1946), was a Welford girl and wanted to live among her family, friends and familiar surroundings. After an initial stay with my grandparents at the old forge opposite what was then The Shoulder of Mutton public house and a short period of residence in a caravan parked on land belonging to the Vaughan brothers, the family moved to a brand new council house in Westfield Crescent.

John was an active sportsman and was instrumental in the resurrection of Welford Victoria Football Club during the early 1950s - he played for the club (usually in goal) and was also the club's secretary for many years.

John moved away from Welford in 1968 mainly because, by this time, the whole family was working in Rugby or Coventry and after the railway closed, transport costs became excessive.

John's cremation will take place at Gilroes Crematorium, Groby Road, Leicester at 2:15 pm on Tuesday, 7 June 2016. Graham Oliver
