


Doorstep Carols

Notes from Welford Parish Council November 2020

- The current bus service runs up to the end of March 2021; the Parish Council is in consultation with other Parish Councils and NCC to discuss if the bus service can continue beyond then and at what cost. This will then be debated at the December meeting
- Daventry District Council has agreed funding and contractor to install an electric vehicle charging point in West Street near to the cemetery. The planned installation is expected sometime in January/February
- As more homes have CCTV cameras there is guidance from the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) as to how they should be used and the correct signage that should be in place. When the filming takes place beyond that property then the public has additional rights and the ICO also has guidance for the public on their website
- The Parish Council continues to meet on a monthly basis using Zoom. Residents are welcome to listen to the proceedings either on the internet or by phone. Details of the meetings are posted on the village website at welfordvillage.org.uk



Nature Notes

In this deep midwinter it may not be particularly cold but so many days have been grey, overcast and cheerless, with the dark evenings starting earlier each day. The occasional sunny day has seemed like a gift. There has been colour, the leaves have been slow to fall, and the russet oaks, golden maples and scarlet cherries have added some gaiety to the gloom, and the countryside is still exceptionally green for the time of year. I have been lucky in the wind direction as most of the leaves have blown away as they fell, so I haven't had to sweep them up.

With only one hard frost so far the dahlias are still in flower, and the little autumn cyclamen, and the holly berries are a blaze of scarlet among their shiny leaves. All the tender perlagoniums and agapanthus pots are in the greenhouse. I have a handy little sack barrow to help me move them. Bulbs are all planted, even though it is hardly cold enough for tulips to go in yet.

It has been a bumper year for fruit. I have a freezer full of apples and plums and pears, as well as all the vegetables and soups.

On the farming front, unlike last year most of the autumn crops have been sown, though now the land is getting very wet and muddy. Some sheep are still outside, and lambs are fetching a good price. Unfortunately some local cattle have reacted to their TB test, which means restrictions on their movement, always a great worry and a financial drain. Turkeys are being advertised, but it is difficult to know how large a bird we shall need until we know how many people we can invite to our Christmas tables. Difficult for us and very difficult for the suppliers.

Only a month to the shortest day, and then spring will be just around the corner! Gardeners and farmers are always looking ahead, not wishing life away, but planning and getting organised for the next phase in the growing cycle. By the next Bugle the days will be getting longer again, and maybe the news will be more hopeful too! Here's hoping, and also hoping that you have a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, with fewer nasty surprises than 2020.

Dear Welford residents and friends,

Inevitably, Christmas is going to be very different this year, and we are unlikely to be able to meet with friends and family in the way that we might want. However, the message of Christmas is unchanged: a baby was born that we might know of God's unfailing love for us.

That baby was born to an unmarried mother, in a strange town, far from



her family, and in a shelter meant for livestock. Clearly, life was not running smoothly for Mary and Joseph, challenges abounded, and it must have been a fearful and uncomfortable time, a time of doubt and uncertainty as to what lay ahead. But in that strange town, help was found; we can be fairly confident that there were experienced women attending to Mary as she gave birth, and to the baby Jesus. There would have been a readiness to step forward and help this young girl through her first birth, a readiness to meet and embrace her needs - and those of the new life that was coming into the world.

Over the last few months, we have known fear and discomfort, separation from loved ones and those whom we might look to for help and support. But we have experienced, too, the kindness and compassion of those around us – and in ways that may have been unexpected, even surprising

That sense of individual commitment to our villages, to caring for our neighbour, has come wonderfully to the fore in recent months. In the midst of isolation many of us have found compassion and fellowship, and a renewed sense of unity and purpose.

One thing that we can all share in is **Doorstep** Carols. This is taking place across the country on **16**th December, 6-7pm. BBC Radio Northampton will be broadcasting the carols and we are all invited to take part and sing along. Carol sheets are available from doorstepcarols.co.uk, or from me. It should be a great communal event, and something we can all be a part of if we have access to BBC Radio!

Services in church are obviously dependent upon Government regulations allowing them to take place, but we plan to have Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve at 11**.30pm, and Family Worship at 11am on Christmas Day** in St. Mary's. If worship in church is not permitted we will have a 10am virtual service via Zoom on Christmas Day, using our usual meeting ID: 697 715 534. If you have any queries, do get in touch.

So, yes, Christmas will be different but it is my hope that it will be a time when we truly celebrate the love and light that came down to Bethlehem so many years ago, in the midst of darkness and doubt.

With every blessing on you all, and may you know Christ's comfort and joy this Christmas tide. Miranda

COME AND SING CAROLS

In 1960 Mr Twemlow, the headmaster of Welford School and conductor of Welford and District Choral Society, instituted the first 'Come and Sing Carols' on Christmas Eve in Welford Church. When 'Twemmy' died in 1976, Philip Gardner continued the tradition and when W&DCS ceased in 2000, the young people of Welford Church Choir led the event, replaced in recent years by former choristers joined by 'more mature' volunteers. This year would have been the 60th Anniversary of an event that has marked the joyous and enthusiastic start to Christmas proper for so many and has raised a considerable amount of money for charity - just in the past 14 years over £15000, a portion of which included the proceeds of carol singing

around the village and the generous contribution of WSSES's Christmas concerts. Since 2001 this money has been divided between the Cynthia Spencer Hospice and a number of child-orientated charities. Such charities are extremely hard-hit by the pandemic which has affected all our lives in such dramatic and, for many, devastating ways. The pandemic has managed to cause what rain and tempest, frost and flood could not: the cancellation of an event that has brought to so many in Welford and beyond a joyous and interactive start to the Christmas festivities. 

2020 Cricket Season - Down ...but Not Out!

After the heights of the 2019 cricket season, with the national team winning the ICC World Cup for the first time, Ben Stokes becoming the BBC Sports Personality of the Year and locally, the joint Welford & Yelvertoft Junior Cricket initiative successfully launching the ECB 'Allstars' programme for ages 5 to 8, there were high hopes that interest in playing cricket might experience an uplift this seasonbut then Covid 19 arrived with other ideas .

New junior kit was purchased, Indoor Practice Sessions at Guilsborough Academy were booked for U11 & U13 'Hardball ' players (thanks, as always to WET for their financial support) and fingers were crossedbut then Covid 19 arrived at the end of March in a big way and recreational cricket at all levels was suspended until early July, as the World grappled with the first pandemic in most of our lifetimes .

Instead, like most of the rest of the population, we were obliged to resort to online activity through a 8 week programme of key skills cricket activity designed by Northamptonshire County Cricket Club for 'Allstars', U11's and U13's for delivery by parents/guardians in the back garden, back yard or even in the kitchen! Feedback was positive, but it doesn't replace practicing and playing outdoors with your mates.

Sadly, by the time clearance was given for recreational cricket to re-start in a Covid 19 secure environment, and with our own WCC/YCC Covid 19 secure event guidelines locally approved and published to parents, most of the junior season had already gone. Interest in playing had mostly been lost, and the summer holiday season had arrived. An attempt was made to try and re-start some outdoor junior activity in mid-August, but the numbers interested and available to play were too low to make anything worthwhile, and so the 2020 season finished without a single local junior ball being bowled!

However, despite all of this, there were some positive signs to emerge from this "anti-climax" of a season. Firstly, there are still lads (very happy to see lasses as well) at Allstars U11 & U13 age levels interested in playing locally in both Welford, Yelvertoft and the surrounding villages where most of our players come from. Welford still remains one of the very few villages in this area to continue to offer the chance for our youngsters to play junior cricket from May to August. Encouragingly, there could also be enough senior players interested in playing "Sunday Social Cricket" for a re-launched Welford village team, the first time for nearly 10 Years. It's also been great to see International cricket back on terrestrial TV, although it takes a bit of getting used to watching with no spectators present!

Covid 19 and all its implications is highly likely to play a massive role in the 2021 season as well, but as we enter our planning cycle for next year we remain hopeful that cricket will continue to adapt to the "New Normal" in a safe and secure way for all players, whether senior or junior. If you, your lad or lass is interested in being involved next season in any capacity (direct ongoing involvement with the juniors will require relevant course attendance and cricket specific DBS clearance), please make contact over the next few months with either of the below .

Please rest assured that boxes will be quarantined for *at least 5 days*, before delivery in the week commencing 21st December.


