Notes from Welford Parish Council

- It has become very apparent in the last few weeks that careless dog owners are not clearing up after their dog. This has been particularly noticeable on the Playing Field where children play and along some of the village footpaths. The famers have also made us aware of dog fouling in the fields along public footpaths which leads to disease among farm animals. Dog faeces can cause serious diseases in sheep through the contamination of food and water. Dog waste on grazing land can pass worms and parasites to sheep. Another disease, neosporosis in cattle, is spread through eggs in dog mess and it is a major cause of abortions in herds., so it is vital that dog owners pick up their dogs' droppings when walking pets on farm land.
- bus service will have an updated timetable from the 19th April with some journeys to and from Northampton through Brixworth. The timetable will be available on the village website
- The Electric Vehicle charge point should be installed opposite the church in West Street in the next few weeks.
- The Parish Council have formally adopted the street lighting on the Phase 1 Millers Lock and Northamptonshire notified Council of this; the Parish Council have also informed the County Council that we have no objection to adoption of the roads



Thank you to everyone who completed one of the wildlife diaries. We're compiling a list of all the species you recorded in your gardens and on your walks. We'll publish the results soon.

Thanks Welford Parish Council who funded the project as part of the Neighbourhood Plan. Meanwhile, in the first of a series on wildlife that you can see in Welford, here's a real success story.

Red Kite (Milvus milvus)

Watching a red kite soaring and circling in the skies over Welford is such a delight. They are unmistakable with their distinctive forked tail, mewing cries and huge wingspan.

If you take six pages of The Bugle and lay them lengthways end to end, that's the distance from wingtip to wingtip of a typical kite (1.8 metres, nearly six feet). Yet kites only weigh around a kilo, less than one of those mallards that you see paddling along the canal. A red kite will live, on average for four years.

It is only very recently that the red kite has become such a common sight for us. In the 1930s, they were almost extinct in the British Isles. Just two pairs were nesting in Mid Wales. Persecution by humans by poisoning or shooting and egg collection was also a major reason for their decline.

A small and dedicated band of conservationists ensured that by 1967 there were 20 breeding pairs and by 1992, 80. Since then, the red kite has been the major success story for the countryside.


It is estimated that the British Isles will eventually host a population of 50,000 pairs - more than double the current world population. I suspect that those we see over Welford are descended from 11 birds released at Rockingham in 1995.

Like buzzards which are similar but don't have that elegant tail, they swoop down to eat carrion but they will take small live mammals, birds and even earthworms.

Historically, red kites were associated with towns and cities. Superb scavengers that they are, they helped to keep the medieval streets clean. William Shakespeare makes several references to them.

One of the characters in The Winters Tale, warns that 'when the kite

builds (its nest) look to lesser linen'. This means keep an eye out for your underwear on the washing line. Given the chance, kites will steal your pants to decorate their nests which are very untidy structures, often built on top of an old crow's nest.



Nature Notes

Gradually the countryside is greening over. If you look closely at the Hawthorne hedges some have fat round buds about to burst and others already have tender bright green leaves. The lilac has quite a lot of leaf, the sycamore buds are gently swelling, and any day the whole countryside will boast that fresh green that thrills us for a few glorious weeks each spring. Some blossom is appearing too, and the camellias are putting on their spectacular spring show. The daffodils have been nodding cheerfully for some weeks, and grape hyacinths and tulips are making an appearance. On a sunny day the world looks inviting and full of promise.

The greenhouse is showing promise too, with trays of seeds germinating almost as we watch. Shepherding the plants is a daily delight, with more broad beans and the potatoes I planted in pots showing more leaves all the time. I have 7 large pots this year and we do enjoy stealing a march by eating really earl new potatoes. We're already relishing Purple Sprouting Broccoli and new seasons Rhubarb.

Our fields are empty at the moment as we wait for ewes and lambs to come back from their winter quarters. The grass needed a rest to give it a chance for a spring flush. If the lawn is anything to go by there will be plenty of growth. I've mown the lawn twice already. There are lots of early lambs to admire if you walk down Hall Lane or through the nearby fields on the footpaths. They are skipping about and look plenty strong enough to withstand the colder, wetter days that come with the Blackthorn Winter.

Rubbish, or litter, continues to plague the verges. More people are joining in the clean up campaign, which is really encouraging, but the fly tipping is getting worse. Along the A14 and main roads the trees are festooned with plastic. As the leaves appear this is disguised for the summer, but it degenerates and pollutes unseen if no-one collects it, and it is too dangerous a job for amateurs like me.

All most of us can do is to keep our own patch clear, and enjoy the softening growth that is magically transforming our corner of Northamptonshire.

Jobs for the Garden - April

April is the perfect month to start waking your garden up, sowing seeds, lifting, dividing and planting. It is also the right time to incorporate slow release fertilisers such as well rotted manure, chicken manure pellets or homemade compost into your borders and around your established shrubs and fruit trees. Giving your greenhouse a good scrub at the start of the season will kill off any pests and diseases that may have been lingering over winter, while scrubbing the windows allows more light in for your new seedlings. As the weather starts to warm up weed seeds start to germinate, picking them out now and mulching your borders will save time and effort later on. Here is a condensed list of ideas for your garden this April:

Seeds

- Sow annuals directly where they are to flower, try marigolds, cornflowers or poppies
- Sow sunflowers indoors for summer flowers.
- Start your very own herb garden by sowing basil, coriander and parsley.
 Flowers
- Plant dahlias in pots or directly into the ground.
- Look after your roses, they will be hungry after winter so mulch their roots with a slow release fertiliser. Snip off any dead wood and tie in climbing roses.
- Lift and divide congested summer flowering perennial plants to improve their vigour and create new plants for your garden or neighbours.
- Deadhead daffodils, hyacinths and narcissus, allowing the leaves to die back naturally. This helps the bulbs make more food and come back stronger next year.
- Trim heather flowers back to stop the plants getting leggy over summer. Vegetables
- Support emerging beans and peas by pushing in canes or twiggy sticks around them.
- Thin out March sown seedlings such as carrots, beetroot and spinach. Continue successional sowing of salad leaves.
- Continue to plant first earlies & second earlies to get a good potato supply over summer.
- Sow tomatoes under cover, or plant out plug plants. Tumbling varieties are great for hanging baskets.
- Sow cucumber, courgette, squash and marrows, push them in vertically to prevent rotting when you water them.

Fruit

- Plant your strawberries, you could try putting early varieties under a cloche to get an earlier crop.
- If space is tight try strawberries in a hanging basket or wall planter.
- Plant out any raspberry canes, rhubarb crowns or other fruit bushes.
- ** Free sunflower seeds are available at the Husbands Bosworth pop up shop in April so grab a pack and have a go **

The New Guaranteed Mortgage Scheme

The Government hopes that by offering a plan to guarantee mortgages, lenders will be willing to reintroduce low-deposit lending. Many stopped offering high loan

-to-value (LTV) deals during the pandemic, amid fears over how Covid-19 could impact the economy.

Lenders view 95% mortgages as higher risk, since they're at the mercy of falling house prices, with borrowers potentially ending up in owing more than their home is worth.

The idea behind the new 95% home loans is that they will provide a real boost for many would-be homebuyers who are unable to raise 10%.

Some key questions and answers.

How much deposit will I need?

Instead of needing a 10% deposit – and having to save £20,000 to buy a £200,000 home – you will now only need a 5% deposit. This means only having to amass £10,000 to buy that same £200,000 property.

What's the borrowing limit?

Loans will be available for properties costing up to £600,000.

When does the scheme begin and end?

The Guaranteed Mortgage Scheme is due to launch in April 2021 - and will run until December 31, 2022.

Why is it being introduced now?

The hope is that this scheme – alongside the stamp duty holiday extension – will offer a welcome boost for firsttime buyers and those with smaller deposits, and therefore help the market as a whole.

Which banks are taking part?

So far, Lloyds, Santander, NatWest, HSBC and Barclays have all said they are looking to offer 95% mortgages once the scheme begins.

What sort of interest rates can borrowers expect?

As yet, no details of actual rates have been revealed, but generally speaking, rates on low-deposit mortgages tend to be higher than those on mortgages requiring a bigger deposit.

Does the scheme only apply to first-time buyers?


No. Current homeowners can make use of it too.

Easter Thoughts

As we reach the end of a second spring term without our usual celebrations, we have still been trying hard in school to incorporate the Easter story and thoughts about Lent and Holy Week into our time together, through Collective Worship and RE lessons. Earlier this term, some of our keyworker provision children were involved in creating part of a prayer trail, which will be travelling between our group of churches between now and Easter.

- Wagtails have learnt the Easter story and sequenced it, and looked at why Christians put a cross in their garden at Easter.
- Woodpeckers have been learning about the story of Easter and why it is so important to Christians, discussing why Hot Cross buns have a cross on them, to symbolise Jesus on the cross and can be eaten on Good Friday (they tasted theirs slightly early!)
- Robins have been learning about why Christians call the day Jesus died Good Friday. They have explored
 - the events of Holy Week including Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday and written diary entries from the point of view of Mary.
- Kestrels have been trying to answer the question 'Was Jesus the Messiah?', looking at the prophesies made in the Old Testament and comparing them to the story of Jesus' life and death, particularly focusing on Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey.

Welford Pre-school

Well, what a very different year we have had! It's hard to believe that we had to close a year ago for the first lockdown. We reopened 11 weeks later in June, and welcomed back a



lovely small group of children and finished the summer term off with lots of fun and learning. During this time we were trying to maintain social distancing from each other and the children in order to try and keep all our families safe. It was a relief to reach the summer holidays knowing we were all ok

We opened again at the beginning of September to start the autumn term. This time all the school children were finally back in and we could offer our breakfast and after school clubs once again, in addition to all our preschoolers being back. As we needed to keep these 'bubbles' separate, this meant a shortened preschool day in order to allow for cleaning between the different sessions. Lots of quarantining, rotating and cleaning of equipment and sanitising all areas.

January brought another lockdown, but all early years settings were able to stay open as usual. We didn't offer our breakfast and after school clubs then as the school was closed to most children. We were all very happy to be back, although a little confused as to why we were the only sector to be open as usual and with no social distancing, and where the guidance said it wasn't appropriate to wear protective equipment. Unfortunately the sector wasn't given the lateral flow tests that were being given to all schools, but were given the option to travel twice a week to mass testing sites to be tested, if we wished. Over the months quite a few children and staff have had to go and get the PCR tests as they've had various symptoms, but all negative.

Finally, we received delivery of lateral flow tests to be started on March 22nd! So far, all negative!

We've had a great spring term, continuing to follow the children's interests, supporting their developmental progress, and having meetings with parents in the street or over the phone. We have welcomed some new children to our preschool family and have had the settling in visits at the weekends as we can't have visitors in the sessions. The children have been extremely resilient throughout all of this. Their parents can no longer come into the preschool, so we collect the children at the school gate. They all come through the gate smiling, and even if there are occasionally one or two reluctant ones, it doesn't take very long for them to cheer up and enjoy their day.

We have definitely had to change a lot in the way we have worked over the last year, and have had to put a few things on hold, and change the way we do things, but we are still there every day for the children and their families, doing what we can to support them. We have a fabulous pre-school team and a very supportive committee, and we are looking forward to a lot of pre-school fun when the summer term starts on April 12th.
