The Councillors give up their time for the benefit of the village to maintain and improve it for the benefit of all.



LADYBIRD

Coleopteran

There are over 40 species of ladybirds that can be found in the British Isles and 5,000 worldwide.

A type of beetle, they are easy to recognise. The most familiar have bright red wing cases (elytra) with black spots. Others can be black and yellow, white and brown and even striped.

Contrary to popular folklore, you cannot tell the age of a ladybird by counting the spots. There are two main types of ladybird that you will find in Welford: the Two Spot Ladybird and the Seven Spot Ladybird.

The bright red colour is to warn predators of their horrible taste; helping survival. They can also exude a revolting yellow fluid from their legs to warn ants, birds and humans that they are not at all pleasant when eaten. Another trick that ladybirds employ is to 'play dead' when handled or pecked at.

Ladybirds lay their eggs in clusters or rows on the undersides of leaves. The larvae grow quickly and they shed their skins several times before eventually emerging as the familiar red and black beetle.

They hibernate in winter.

Most people like

ladybirds because they are pretty and harmless, but gardeners and farmers absolutely love them as they are aphid-eating machines. Ladybirds live for around a year and in that time can gobble up more than 5000 greenfly. Results that the pesticide manufacturers can only dream of - and without the environmental damage too.

Unfortunately I did not ask her name, but she is a credit to herself and the young of Welford and I would like to flag up her good deed.



Nature Notes

The driest April, the wettest May! It's not so much global warming as climate change that is affecting us. We needed rain and warmth all through early spring, with it's frosty nights, and then, when the rain came it was still not warm enough to encourage growth. Even so, nature has progressed in it's usual stages. Blackthorn winter, bluebells, which were magnificent by the far end of the Hemploe Drive this year as well as at the top of the Devil's Staircase, and now the trees are coming into full leaf, ash trees last as usual, and the dainty cow parsley is lining the lanes and the Horse Chestnuts are in glorious flower. As soon as things warm up, which they may have suddenly done by the time you read this, everything will burgeon into bloom, the peonies and roses are in bud and just waiting, and the aliums are unfolding day by day, and I've got scores of plants I've grown from seed waiting for it to be dry enough for me to get busy moving the pots and borders into summer mode.

On the vegetable front we are in the doldrums. Asparagus is the current treat, coming more and more into its own, but the Purple sprouting broccoli has gone over. We have enjoyed it for weeks. The winter sown broad beans are in full flower and they will be the next treat, as well as the new potatoes I grew in the large tomato pots in the greenhouse, which are really special at this time of year. Lettuces and radishes are coming on, waiting for that elusive sunshine.


The birds have been busy, particularly the blackbirds which are nesting nearby. I have seen a thrush a time or two, which is a welcome sight, and we did have a visit from a green woodpecker. Some swallows, but very few, and no cuckoo yet again

In the fields the lambs are growing fast, and the grass is keeping up with demand. The maize is showing through in long green rows, and the barley and wheat are blowing in the wind, rippling like the sea. There is much less oil seed rape. You may have noticed the absence of bright yellow fields. Farmers have planted a lot more beans instead. I'm sure they want to get on with silage, and there will be a rush of machinery about as soon as the grass and the weather are right.

After a month of dry and a month of wet I wonder what June will bring? Maybe a month of warm sunshine, the traditional flaming June?

Jobs for the Garden - June

Flowers are starting to appear in abundance and there's plenty to harvest in the veg patch. To have big healthy plants, make sure you give them plenty of water and food. There are plenty of choices from home made nettle-comfrey liquid, to slow release chicken manure pellets or a general liquid feed. There are so many things to do in the garden in June to make it look fabulous this Summer, here's a short list to get you started:

Flowers:

- Sow poppies directly where they are to flower as they dislike root disturbance.
- Feed and keep picking sweet peas to keep them flowering. To remove pollen beetles, put them in a dark room with the window open. The beetles will fly towards the light and out the window.
- Thin out hardy annuals like cornflowers and nigella. Aim for a 30cm gap.
- Fill gaps with bedding like geraniums, dianthus, marigolds or whatever takes your fancy. Keep them well watered!
- Sow next years biennials into pots, foxglove, lupin and wallflowers etc
- Cut delphiniums, pulmonarias & oriental poppies back to the ground and feed.
- Support tall or 'floppy' plants from summer winds with with ring supports, stakes or trellis.

Bulbs:

- Lift tulip bulbs to dry and store over winter.
- Continue to plant gladioli for successional flowers
- Plant autumn flowering crocus into lawns
- Feed and stake dahlias, keep an eye out for earwigs!

Vegetables:

- Harvest early potatoes as soon as they begin to flower use them as soon as you can for better flavour.
- Sow squashes, pumpkins and courgettes put two in and prick out the weaker one.
- Continue to sow herbs, salads, radish, beetroot, carrots, beans and sugar snap peas
- Water a pot and sow basil thinly; water every other day. Germination takes 10 days.
- Water grow bags daily, tomatoes, beans and peppers need plenty. Feed them too!
- Direct sow overwintering veg like brassicas and leeks.

Fruit:

- Thin gooseberries, pick out every other one to allow the remaining fruit to ripen for harvest in a months time
- Thin out congested fruit tree branches and reduce any clusters to allow fruits to grow larger and prevent 'June Drop' as much as you can!
- Ripen strawberries in the greenhouse or under glass cloches if they need some help. Hannah Edge—Bosworth Bulbs





Property: Electronic Signatures

One of the side-effects of the Covid-19 pandemic has been a huge increase in the use of electronic signatures on all sorts of documents.



Electronic signing can cover a range of options from simply typing a name into the signature space on a contract in a Microsoft Word document, or sending an email confirming agreement, all the way up to a contract through to the use of a fully-fledged electronic signing platform.

Things like an agent's or solicitor's terms of business, a residential tenancy agreement of less than 3 years, and guarantor agreements under certain conditions are what is called 'simple contracts' and can be signed by any reasonable electronic method. This would include something as simple acknowledgment and acceptance of the terms sent in a personal email.

If a deed is involved, or if it is a company signing a contract then things are more difficult. Electronic signatures can be used for deeds and company signatures but the current legal viewpoint is that the witness must be physically present with the person signing and not add their signature later.

Being a witness is pretty straightforward: it just needs to be someone independent (i.e. not a party to a contract, nor directly affected by it in any way). Family members are acceptable (if not affected by the contract) and an estate agent is an acceptable witness in many instances as well.

So, as you can see, electronic signatures are nothing to be afraid of and are now a permanent part of the property landscape.

P.S. If there are any residential landlords reading this you are now legally obliged to have carried out EICRs on all of your let properties. If you haven't done so then you'd better do it now!



Robins and Kestrels have carried out a reading survey to gather children's thoughts about reading, so that moving forward we can improve what is on offer. The results were really interesting, with 80% of children saying that 'reading is cool', 94% saying that they enjoy an adult reading to them either always or sometimes, and 100% responding 'yes' to the statement 'My teacher is a reader' - so we must be doing something right!

Trek to Tokyo



The Trek to Tokyo Summer Activity Challenge has been organised by Northamptonshire School Sport to encourage an active summer leading up to the Tokyo Olympics. Schools are going on a virtual journey to Tokyo via 8 different countries and host cities before arriving in Tokyo, learning more about the history of the Olympic Games and Team GB along the way. Virtual miles are accumulated by taking part in both school and home-based activities. For example, each person taking part in a PE lesson gets 0.1 mile, whilst intraschool competitions (such as house team matches) gain 0.5miles. We

have been doing brilliantly on our virtual Trek to Tokyo over the past few weeks; we are currently heading towards Moscow, having passed the London, Munich and Rome checkpoints! To help us get even more miles on the clock, and to encourage us to be even more active at lunchtimes, we are trying to complete a daily mile challenge every day by jogging, walking, skipping or running laps of the playground for the first 5 minutes of lunchtime play. Each participant contributes a mile to our total every time they take part, and we're getting fit at the same time! Toni Tull from the Northamptonshire Sport team is supporting us with our PE and our Trek to Tokyo this term, and the children are thoroughly enjoying her brilliant PE lessons every week – even when the weather has been terrible. Believe it or not, we have managed everything from athletics to Kwik Cricket in the school hall this term. We've all got our fingers crossed for some sunshine!



Senior Sunday "Friendly" Cricket Matches .

This takes place at Yelvertoft Playing Fields on a Saturday morning between 9.15 am and 10.15 am from May 29th to July 17th, and at the time of writing, there was just 1 place left! ECB programme rules only allow us a maximum of 24 kids this season.

We are also hoping to run some 'Intermediate' Ball sessions for U11's (the next step up from "Allstars") and 'Hardball' sessions for U13's, but dates and times for these will depend on the level of interest confirmed.
