

Dear Fríends,

Three main things to share with you all this month! 1. Any of you who have been to Peterborough Cathedral will know what an inspiring and spiritual place it is, the presence of God almost palpable, with the great cross over the nave reminding us of God's infinite love and faithfulness towards us.

So, a very special setting for a very special service: the ordination to the priesthood of Father Kris, which took place on 27th June. On occasions in the past, you may have been privileged enough to share in an ordination service but, this year as last, the congregation was severely limited in size. However, I hope that many of you were able to be part of the service via the internet. As I write this, we are still not entirely sure what digital platform the cathedral will use, but the Ministry Team is working hard to ensure that as many of you as possible would be able to link in to it.

Then, a week later, on 4th July, Father Kris will be presiding at his first Sunday service of Holy Communion. It will be a hybrid service at Clipston, so there will be congregation in church, and also a congregation on Zoom so, hopefully, everyone who wants to will be able to be "there". At a later date, I hope we will all have an opportunity to get together informally, perhaps a Benefice picnic, to celebrate this profoundly significant event, and also to celebrate Father Kris, himself, and all that he brings to the Benefice.

And speaking of the future, you will see a more expansive Sunday service schedule in the magazine this month, reflecting the journey we are making towards a regular monthly pattern across the Benefice. What we will have for the next few months will be provisional, as we seek to discern the worship offering in each parish. As a Benefice of 7 parishes, there will, inevitably, be some compromises in terms of the ideal for each place, but let's give things a go and see how we get on! As we put ideas into practice, we can tweak, vary and improve them in ways that meet the needs of current congregations, but also allow "entry points" for those exploring Christianity - some of whom may find formal, liturgical worship complicated, confusing and less than welcoming. 3. Save the date! On Sunday, 22nd August, at 10am, there will be a special hybrid service in All Saints' Clipston, at which Bishop Donald (via Zoom) will Admit Valerie Carpenter as Reader. As most of you will know, alongside the enormously valuable ministry she has already been exercising, Val has been undergoing Reader training for 3 years, and her Admission will be the culmination of a great deal of work on her part; work which has required real commitment and faithfulness to God's call in her life. Please pray for her as she prepares to step out in this new role which (just as with our existing Readers by whom we are already wonderfully blessed), will be exercised across the whole Benefice. Lots going on, and lots to look forward to!
