# Dear Friends,

The Epiphany – what is it all about? Well, the basic story as most of you will know, is about Magi, or wise men, journeying from foreign lands in the East to worship the Christ child, and is a story found in the Gospel according to Matthew, the book which begins the Bible's New Testament. It's an account of the manifestation or revelation, of Christ to the Gentiles, non-Jewish people – for such were the wise men.

There are various theories as to who exactly they were; it could be that they were astrologers from Persia who, as such, would have spent much of their time examining the sky for signs and portents. Whoever they were, though, when they observed a star rising in the East (the Star of Bethlehem), they each recognized it as signifying that the king of the Jews had been born. So the wise men followed the star to Bethlehem of Judea, to the place where Jesus was. When they arrived, they worshipped him, giving the infant gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

It's such a well-known story but, in reality, much of what we believe we know about it is based upon various traditions which have grown up over the years. One of the most familiar is that there were three wise men – a tradition which has developed because of the number of gifts given: in fact, Matthew doesn't tell us how many wise men there were.

Another variation from the 'original' is that we often refer to them as kings – an idea that dates back as far as the  $3^{rd}$  Century, although again Matthew doesn't refer to them in this way.

A further long-standing tradition you may have heard is that their names were *Caspar, Melchior*, and *Balthasar* – again we have no knowledge of the accuracy of this and, indeed, other traditions give them different names. The Syrian Church, for instance, call them *Larvandad*, *Hormisdas*, and *Gushnasaph*, and the Armenian, *Kaqpha*, *Badadakharida* and *Badadilma*.

The great English historian, St. Bede the Venerable, writing in the 8<sup>th</sup> century, offers these imaginative (if historically unreliable!) descriptions of the wise men:

The first was called Melchior. He was an old man, with white hair and a long beard; he offered gold to the Lord as to his King. The second, Gaspar by name, young, beardless, of ruddy hue, offered to Jesus his gift of incense, the homage due to Divinity. The third, of black complexion, with heavy beard, was middle-aged and called Balthasar. The myrrh he held in his hand prefigured the death of the son of Man

As can be seen from this, St. Bede is suggesting that the magi symbolize different ethnic groups, and this is an idea that developed with the wise men said to represent Europeans, Asian, and Africans - the three races known at the time.

Of course, all this is fascinating - but more importantly, it should help us to understand that at the heart of The Epiphany story is the knowledge that Jesus came not just to save the Jewish people – amongst whom he was born – but the whole world.
