FOX Vulpes vulpes

The fox with its distinctive red-brown coat, bushy tail and black-tipped ears must be the most opportunist of British mammals. As an accomplished scavenger, a fox will eat practically anything from earthworms to restaurant leftovers. Particularly partial to poultry, confined chickens can sometimes be easy prey if not properly secured. Foxes often have well-deserved adjectives applied to them: wily and cunning are just two.

Foxes hunt at night and will spend most daylight hours underground in an 'earth'. This will often have a musty smell. During the mating season, the screams of a vixen can be quite eerie. Litters of typically four to six cubs will be born in the earth each spring.

No animal has divided public opinion more than the fox, and it is inextricably linked to our



culture in so many ways: a favourite children's character in Roald Dahl's 'Fantastic Mr Fox'; celebrated on the signboards of countless pubs across the country; you can dance the foxtrot if it takes your fancy; even wear a dead one around your neck as the 1920s fashion dictated. Second World War general Rommel was famously known as 'The Desert Fox', who was eventually out-foxed himself. Perhaps even support our nearest Premiership football team in Leicester; The Foxes.

Leicestershire, particularly Melton Mowbray, was the epicentre of the fox hunting world. There, the expression 'to paint the town red' originated. In 1837, the Marquis of Waterford hosted wild celebrations after a particularly successful meet - literally coating the White Swan Inn and other buildings in the town red.

Major Guy Paget of Sulby was a very notable part of our local hunt, the Pytchley, and the hunt would often meet at Welford.

Nature Notes

It's so much easier to write about the great outdoors on a bright sunny day. We have suffered under a lot of chilly gloom recently, but as I write it is all forgotten, even if it is still rather chilly.

The countryside is looking surprisingly green for the time of year, and I actually mowed the lawn in December, and have heard of others doing the same. The bulbs are all shooting and without entering the great snowdrop debate on Winterwatch I can report that ours are in flower, and have been for a couple of weeks, so spring really is around the corner whatever the weather has left to throw at us.

Despite a reportedly dry January the ground is still very soggy. Our new fruit trees have been planted between frosts, but it was a very muddy job. The winter sown broad beans seem to have been eaten, we presume by mice, so spring ones will soon be put in pots to protect them while they establish. I have new potatoes chitting in the summerhouse, ready to be 'forced' in the greenhouse, and lots of seeds waiting to be sown in trays.

The evenings are getting noticeably lighter, though the mornings are a bit slower. The last full moon, the Wolf Moon, was spectacular, and we were lucky to have some clear nights to enjoy it. One evening at 5ish I was walking down the village street and the huge silver moon rose straight in front of me, a memorable sight.

Trying to be eco friendly, I have discovered that cleaning the woodburner glass with a damp cloth dipped in ash is really effective. When we first had the stove I was sold some kind of chemical spray, but don't need that any more, and it is lovely sitting by a cheerful blaze in the evenings. The knitting is coming along nicely!

February gardening tips

Spring is in sight! So there are plenty of things to be getting on with in the garden during a weather window in February.

The Vegetable Patch

- Prepare your beds by digging up perennial weeds and covering with cloches, polythene, or fleece to warm the soil for earlier planting.
- Chit early and maincrop potatoes pop them in some egg boxes and put them somewhere warm and dry to sprout before planting in March.
- Plant garlic, shallot and onion sets out
- Sow broad beans early in Feb to avoid blackfly as much as possible.
- Sow salad crops under cover to get ahead lettuces, radish, chard and spring onions.

Flowers

- Sow sweet peas undercover, try using toilet rolls or individual modules to minimise root disturbance when you transplant them outside in spring.
- Divide crowded snowdrops and pop them around the garden for more plants next year.
- Prune wisteria, jasmines, rhododendron and summer flowering clematis.
- Cut back Cornus (dog woods) and Salix (willows) to promote summer growth.

The Fruit Patch

- Plant deciduous trees or move them while they are still dormant. They also benefit from a good mulch of rotted manure or garden compost this time of year. Take care mulch the roots and not mound it up the stems.
- Protect any early fruit blossoms from frosts, but ensure pollinating insects have access.
- Prune and mulch fruit bushes to maintain their productiveness
- Cover strawberry plants to encourage an earlier crop. Hannah Edge Bosworth Bulbs




