

# Dear Friends

As you probably already know, Easter Sunday, that greatest and most joyous Festival in the Church year, falls on 17<sup>th</sup> April this year.

In preparation for Easter, and to bring it into focus, we first journey through Lent, with its themes of self-examination, penitence, self-denial and study. Living out these themes can bring real growth and depth to our Christian lives, make Easter even more significant and meaningful. It may be that you will be joining one of our Home Groups, or finding other ways of using Lent effectively. Whatever you do, it is so important to find time to reflect, to think, to meditate, and so I commend to you the short reflective services which will be taking place on Thursday evenings during Lent, a time to pause as our lives becoming increasingly busy – see the advert elsewhere in the magazine for details.

One of the Sundays in Lent is, of course, Mothering Sunday, this year falling on 27<sup>th</sup> March. It is the day when we remember and give thanks for our mothers, and all those individuals who fulfil that nurturing and caring role for us.

Alongside Christmas and Easter Day, Mothering Sunday is a date in the church calendar which has been absorbed into wider culture, and is celebrated by almost everyone, regardless of faith or religion. Whilst the commercial aspects are deeply challenging, it seems to me there is something profoundly encouraging about the fact that we are all reminded of the importance of this basic human need for the sort of selfless, encouraging love that many but sadly not all - of us receive from our mothers.

But there is, of course, another and actually much older and more accurate focus for Mothering Sunday: in the church's year, this day is not first and foremost about our earthly mothers, but rather for the eternal caring of that rather peculiar and ill-matched community known collectively as "The Church". It's a day when we celebrate the church's role in proclaiming God's selfless love for the whole world. God has invited each and every one of his children to step into his embrace, and embrace one another.
