





Frances Jasmine Stacey 1940-2022

Frances Jasmine Rench was born into a farming family on the 19th August 1940, the middle of 3 children. She vividly remembered the Land Army girls that worked at the farm in her early years. Her own main role on the farm was to care for the cade lambs, and she inherited a love for the Shire Horse from her father, and from an early age would help him to care for the gentle giants, often joining him in showing the horses at County Shows.

The Shipston on Stour Young Farmers Club was a large part of young Frances' social calendar, and it was here that she met her future husband Michael Stacey, a farm manager from Birmingham. They were married at Easter in 1916 and moved to Moreton in the Marsh, where their first child Ruth was born. Andrew and John followed and the family was complete with the arrival of Richard in 1970.

The insecure nature of employment in farming meant they often had to move, and eventually Michael decided to join the prison service to provide stability. He was based at HMP Gartree and the family moved to Welford in 1970.

Frances took every opportunity to join in village organisations such as the Tufty Club, Guides and Scouts, the Gardening Club and the Bowling Club. Church bell ringing became a family activity for the many years that Michael was Tower Captain. Frances also loved being a member of the WI and held various positions including president on a number of occasions and was still a committee member at her death.

Frances was an expert seamstress. Her skill was such that her curtains hang in Rockingham Castle, and there must be many of her curtains and blinds still adorning Welford homes.

Frances campaigned alongside Michael on many issues to ensure that Welford's history was not lost, such as the restoration of the well at the top of Well Lane, but the longest and most satisfying project was for a safe pedestrian path from Welford to The Wharf. It took many years and a lot of time and energy and Frances was deeply moved and honoured when Stacey's bridge was named in recognition of their efforts.

Following the sad loss of Michael in 2002, Frances slowly rebuilt her life. She took over the responsibility for raising the flags in the churchyard and recording the monthly rainfall for the Bugle. She became a volunteer at the school, and loved listening to the children reading their books. She joined the Luncheon Club, the Good Neighbours Coffee Morning and recently the Friendly Club at Cold Ashby. She was a longstanding member of the Cold Ashby Bowls Club and would often play 2-3 matches a week and was very successful in inter club matches.

Front row seats were always booked for WADS productions to watch granddaughter Stacy in her various roles, comedies and pantos always enjoyed!

Family were very important to Frances and she will be sadly missed by her children, grandchildren and beloved new great grandson Max, and by her wider circle of family and friends of many years.

Nature Notes

What a strange season! We have had drought and rain, cold and extreme heat, yet somehow the vegetable garden has been more productive than usual. Strawberries were abundant, our one gooseberry bush was loaded, blackcurrants and redcurrants cropped well on second year from new bushes, broad beans were twice as productive as usual, and mange tout peas have been delicious too. The first tomatoes taste so good, and tiny carrots have a wonderful flavour. Now tiny beans are forming on French and runner bean plants, the sweet corn is loving the weather, apples and raspberries promise to keep us going in the coming months. The main jobs now are weeding, watering and harvesting!

The flower garden has been more of a challenge, needing a lot of watering, especially the pots which dry out so quickly, but it all repays the effort, except the poor lawns which are tinder dry and brown, so not a pretty sight, but the upside is that they don't need mowing. I don't feel justified in using precious water to sprinkle the grass.

Harvest is beginning. We have seen some loads of straw travelling west along the A14. The problem is that the grain is too dry and yields may be down, just what is not needed at this time of world shortage.

We are worried about the ash trees that are such a feature of our landscape. Ash die back is becoming more widespread. You can see dead branches and poor leafage as you drive around. The East Midland news was reporting how many ash trees are being felled for safety in Leicester already, and locally the majority look in danger. They are replacing the Leicester trees, but didn't say which variety are considered more future proof.

It has been strange chatting to people who are pleased to be cool instead of wanting sunshine all the time. Our taste of near 40 degrees was quite salutary - we just need a good old British summer of sunshine and showers, not blazing heat followed by torrential rain. I wonder what August and September will bring?

Great news! Welford Parish Council has won a Lottery Fund grant to look at planting more trees and hedges. We need your help to make it happen.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Trees help us to slow down global warming by capturing carbon dioxide.

Wildlife needs trees for food and shelter. Loss of habitat has contributed to Britain losing a quarter of its woodland birds in the last 50 years.

Northamptonshire already has a third less trees than similar areas.

Now, ash die-back disease is forecast to kill four out of five ash trees.

About half the mature trees in Welford are ash.

THE PLAN

The lottery money we have is to pay for expert support to create a long-term masterplan for getting everyone working together and planting trees.

To begin, we need an accurate record of trees in and around Welford for the experts to work with.

If you plant a tree in your garden, this year, you can add it to the Queen's Green Canopy at

https://queensgreencanopy.org/ map-education-hub/qgc-map It will help them help us to pinpoint the best locations for new trees and decide what kind of trees we should be planting.

William Frank Gardner (Bill) 1927-2022

Bill Gardner, who until 1988 was Welford's High Street Grocer, died at the Andrew Cohen Care Home in Birmingham on April 16th 2022, having celebrated his 95th birthday only a week earlier. He is survived by his daughter Jill and son Peter, his wife Dorothy having died in June 2017.

Bill was born and grew up in Welford, the son of Frank and Mary Gardner. Frank ran the village shop at 23 High Street, and when Bill left school in 1941 he began to work for him. However, in May 1945, just as the second World war was drawing to close, Bill was called to serve in the army, and he joined the Grenadier Guards. He saw most of his military service in Germany and he witnessed a lot of suffering and sadness, but two of the highlights of this time were being promoted to Corporal, and being selected to represent his battalion as an athlete, for which he was excused other duties and given extra rations.

On being demobbed in 1948 he returned to Welford and the family business. This turned into an amazing father-son partnership over many years. In 1957 Frank and Bill swapped roles and Bill became Grocer-in-Chief while Frank continued to assist him until his detain 1970.

In 1954 Bill married Dorothy, the village school teacher who had arrived from Wales to take up her post 4 years earlier. They set up home in a new house which was built for them in the back garden of Bill's parents house, and they lived there at 25, High Street until 1986.

The shop served Welford but also took, and delivered, orders from the residents of neighbouring villages. In the early 50's these included people in the Polish resettlement camp at Husbands Bosworth. Bill provide their groceries and Dorothy taught their children at the village school.

Later on, when he took over the management of the business, Bill updated the shop to became self-service, and dealt with many fresh challenges, including decimalisation and the introduction of VAT. When in the 80's the fabric of the old premises (at 23 High Street) gave considerable cause for concern, Bill and Dorothy took the difficult decision to build brand new premises and relocate their home and business further down the street (to 29-31 High Street). The easy way out would have been to abandon the crumbling building and retire early, but Bill didn't want to leave the village without the all-important asset of a village store. He got the new shop up and running, and then was happy to retire to Cheshire where he and Dorothy spent the next 8 years before moving again to Kings Heath in Birmingham.

Bill had many interests and talents. He was an excellent ballroom dancer and a keen tennis player in his younger days, and he was a Church Warden in Welford for many years. Although he moved away in 1988 Welford still has much be thankful to Bill for, and many of us still remember him, Dorothy, Jill and Peter very fondly.


