
#### Welford Village Hall Cinema returns



# Notes from the Parish Council

- The Parish Council Planning Committee met on Friday 23rd September, one of the items that attracted a lot of interest was the proposed slurry lagoon on Court Lane. The Council has made representations to the Planning Officer in relation to this proposal and has also taken into account the views of residents. The Council is also keeping our Unitary Councillors up to date on this matter so that they are able to consider and represent the village at WNC Planning meetings
- There is a concern about children on bikes exiting the playing field onto the garage forecourt via the fence gap then cycling across it onto the A5199. There is concern in the way the children exit the forecourt and parents/ grandparents are asked to remind children about the dangers of the A5199 and taking care
- The Parish Council is reviewing some of the equipment in the children's play area on the Playing Field as it has become economically unviable to repair some of the equipment. Some of the equipment will be replaced in the new year and the Council will consider other changes next year.

**Commentary:** Following the sad loss of Frances who has collated this data for some time, we now have Stuart Chadwick who has agreed to take this on and provide us with local, Welford-specific rainfall information which we know many people enjoy seeing. As a result of this changeover, May-July 2022 have had to be calculated from data available across Northamptonshire and therefore are not specific data collection from Welford. August 2022 onwards is again reflecting actual Welford collections.

The data clearly demonstrates the low rainfall reported in local and national press (and as each of us has experienced in our gardens!) with both July and August 2022 being the lowest for those months across all the records.

Doing some analysis of the trends, we can also see the swings in rainfall we've experienced in the last 4 years, with 6 of the driest months and 9 of the wettest months all occurring in the last 4 years.

It's been a warm, dry summer and it's all too easy to focus on the last few months, but looking at this longer 4 year pattern, the message is actually one of it being wetter over this extended view. The trend for the 'Prev 4 Year Average' moves significantly higher in 2019, dragged up by the significant rain we experienced that year. Since the high rainfall in 2019, the total rainfall has reduced each year, though 2021 was still wetter than the years prior to 2019. Our current year data is incomplete but it is currently heading for being the driest on record, bringing the 4 year average back in line with previous trends.

In summary, 2022 may have been a dry year with almost every month being well below average rainfall, but we've had some wet years recently so

we probably should enjoy it!

## <u>Jeni O'May 15.02.1962 - 29.06.2022</u>

Jeni and her husband Tim Fuller met as students in Portsmouth where she studied fine art, he engineering. She started her career as a care assistant at The Coombe Farm home for Cerebral Palsied adults. She had worked there before as a volunteer, and she loved her job. She was already talking about taking a post graduate course in Art Therapy, a brilliant way to combine her passions for art and for caring. Jeni made sure that Tim's feminist credentials were up to scratch, and kept her own name when they married in 1987. At first they lived in Lancaster' enjoying long walks in the three areas of outstanding natural beauty on their doorstep, though for the first year of marriage they spent much of their time separated by a couple of hundred miles while Jeni studied for an MA in Art Therapy at the Hertfordshire College of Art and Design in St Albans.

In 1989 the first of 3 children, Calum was born, followed by Heather in 1993. The family moved to Welford for work in 1995, and that turned out to be a great thing. The local primary school was very good, small and nearby. Elspeth was born in 1996, completing the family.


By 1999 Jeni was ready return to work and she teamed up with Jayne Thomas to run the Welford Playgroup. Jeni and Jayne loved the children and were instrumental in developing the playgroup into a preschool via the move to a portacabin in the Welford school grounds. Jeni completed a distance learning course in Preschool Practice. She also took her caring skills to a new level by wearing the Special Educational Needs hat.

Jeni left the preschool in 2005 and became a teaching assistant at Guilsborough secondary school. Again, she gravitated towards those with special educational needs and mental health issues. The Head was very supportive and in 2009, via an arduous process, she was registered with the Health and Care Professional Council.

As a self-employed therapist she built her clientele over several years including work for Guilsborough secondary and primary schools, The Banyan Tree - a residence for young people and KidsAid, a Northampton child support charity. In 2016 with several colleagues she started Orchard Therapeutic Services, a Community Interest Company. They won multiple contracts with schools and Northamptonshire County Council. Jeni and a friend also started a voluntary older adults art therapy group at Brixworth. For Jeni it wasn't about the money, it was about connection and helping people. She was always trying to improve herself, attending training courses, including Theraplay with Children First. Sadly she was unable to complete that training.

When Jeni became ill it was heartbreaking that she had to let clients down and withdraw from all she had built up over 10 years.

Her family were very important to her and she created beautiful homes, kitting them out with tasteful decor and too many cushions! In 2013 their coach house was converted into an art studio, where she produced fantastic art work, a wonderful legacy for the family. There are so many memories of holidays and walks in beautiful places. Jeni died far too young and our sympathies go to Tim and their children.

## <u> Alex Foreman – A Welford Village Boy</u>

Alex moved to Welford from London aged three with his parents and younger brother Ian and quickly became part of village life. He started school at just four and made many lifelong friendships.



He became a cub as soon as he could followed by the scouts, after being confirmed he became a server at church and helped ring the bells. He joined the WADS working behind the scenes and later helped with the sounds and lights. His love of action saw him become a founder member of Welford Hockey club, a sport he and Ian enjoyed together.

He loved the great outdoors and helped on local farms including the Garners and Mathews farms. He got his tractor license at sixteen. He became a Young Farmer and was involved with many of the club's activities.

At sixteen he was offered a three year apprenticeship with GEC Alsthom in Rugby and after doing this he went on to Wolverhampton University where he obtained a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

The opportunity arose for him and his friend Darren to run the Wharf Inn, so he left his job to start a new career as a pub landlord. After ten happy years there he moved to the Elizabethan where he established a successful games room with darts and his favourite game of Pool.

In 2017 Alex married Shellie at Welford Church and celebrated with a party and BBQ at the pub. Sadly in 2018 the Owner of the property decided to close the property for renovation work and Alex had to leave.

Alex moved to Rothwell to be closer to his mother and joined the local conservative club where he soon became involved with the club helping behind the bar and the other jobs that needed doing. He made many new friends, and with Shellie ran a local Pool team.

For the last three years Alex worked for World of Sheds in Leicester and was kept busy building sheds all through lockdown, he was joined here by his old Welford friend Ben Adkins.

Alex died suddenly at the age of 47 years on the 8th September after a brief spell in hospital. His life was short be he enjoyed it and Lived it to the full.

## Nature Notes

We have just passed the equinox, now the dark is longer than the light each day, but the weather was so glorious that it didn't seem depressing. There are usually equinoxial gales, but a few tranquil sunny days have made the arrival of autumn seem less of a threat. The harvest was safely gathered in very early this year, and rain has been needed to germinate the newly sown crops for next year.

I have been picking blackberries and sloes, and have never seen such abundance. The Hawthorn bushes are covered in berries and there is a good crop of rosehips, all shining in the sun. The old saying is that lots of berries mean a hard winter to come - we shall see. The Fieldfares and Redwings will enjoy them when they come swooping along the hedgerows.

In the last two months we have seen the grass parched in gardens and fields, but some welcome rain has revived it and the sheep are happily grazing and the lawnmower is back in use. so many of the flowers in my garden failed to really thrive despite conscientious watering, but the rain that fell recently, after the dramatic thunder and lightening, has made all the difference. The half hearted dahlias are now flourishing, and the michaelmas daisies are about to put on a colourful display. We have had some chilly nights, so I hope early frosts don't spoil the show!

I haven't seen a hedgehog for years, but one has been found in the garden, hiding under a dead fern. As they are mainly nocturnal one doesn't often see them, though they do leave evidence of their presence!

The vegetable garden is still productive, but the usually reliable runner beans were an occasional treat rather than a glut. The French beans have been good, the sweet corn less productive than usual, the carrots and beetroot prolific - must make more soup - and the tomatoes in the greenhouse have loved the summer. As for the apples, they look amazing, but only just ripening, not yet passing the Monty Don twist the stem test, though a couple of fallers have been delicious. Kale is ready to eat and a small army of leeks looks promising.

I tried to book a chimney sweep, and have one coming in November as they are very busy. Apparently a lot of people are going back to open fires or wood burners during the current fuel crisis. We are lucky to live in the countryside and have the option to do that! Susie Bevin

## October gardening tips

October is the time to enjoy autumn colours, which are a little early this year and crispy cold days. Its a good time to start tidying and preparing for the dormant winter months. One job might be to clean out water butts and allow the autumn rains to fill them again, perhaps installing an extra water butt ready for next year's summer. Lawn Care

- Sweep up any fallen leaves that harbour fungal spores and provident hiding places for slugs and snails. Use them to make leaf mould for the garden.
- Make the last mowing of the year in October

• Aerate the lawn with a garden fork to avoid compaction and repair any bare patches.

Flowers

- After tidying flower borders, mulch with bark chips, well rotted manure, leaf mould or spent mushroom compost to insulate plant roots for the winter and keep weed growth in check.
- Lift and divide perennials while the soil is warm
- Lift and store dahlia tubers, gladioli and begonia corms, remove and dead material and store in dry sand, sawdust or soil in a cool dry place over winter

Vegetables

- If your greenhouse is looking emptier now, give it a good sort out and clean to remove pests and diseases.
- Harvest the last peas and beans, pumpkins and squashes before the frosts
- Plan your bean and pea sites for next year by digging deep trenches and filling with manure or kitchen waste.
- Reuse spent grow bags by cutting the top off and sowing salad seeds, protect with a cloche or fleece from early frost.
- Hang unripe peppers and tomatoes upside down inside to help ripen them. Or put them in a paper bag with a banana, (I know; crazy)

Fruit

- Its a perfect time to plant fruit trees and shrubs, or to lift and move them.
- Lift and divide congested rhubarb clumps.
