

Dear Friends,

I think that we could all easily wake up in the mornings and wonder, "What is the point?". The news and the newspapers Dear friends, are dominated by disasters, the war in Ukraine, floods in Pakistan, repression in Afghanistan and Iran, and that is before we even get to issues in the UK around government, personalities, stories of coups, raising mortgages, cost of living crises and the lack of Kelloggs Frosties (there are other brands!). Of course closer to home we now find ourselves without a Vicar for the seven local Parishes of which we are a part.

By the time you are reading this the four Lay Ministers (Readers) in the Naseby Group Benefice will just be packing their bags to attend the Peterborough Diocesan, Conference for Clergy/Lay; the last to be led by Bishop Donald before his retirement in January. (His last service, outside of the Cathedral, is to be held on January 1<sup>st</sup> in the Naseby Group in Welford at 10.30am . Please do come and give him a great send-off. He has served as the Bishop of Peterborough Diocese for 12 years).

The Bishop wants the theme of the conference to be about Looking forward, not backwards, so the title is "Rejoice in Hope". Attendees have been invited to submit any type of artwork to display during the conference of what "Rejoice in Hope" might mean to each one of us. As I had been focussing on the seven "I AM" statements of Jesus I felt these would be a great place to start, so more of that next month. But each of these statements give us great opportunities to "Rejoice in Hope"

Jesus knew what it was to be a refugee, for his first few years he and his parents had nowhere to lay their heads that was their own. He knew what it was not to have any financial means of his own and to rely on basic food and clothing from kind hearted strangers. The drink he cried out for on his way to his crucifixion, and the tomb he was laid in after death was given by strangers; during his life he was rejected by people in his own village, many of his friends left him, some betrayed him so He is well equipped to walk alongside each and everyone of us whatever trials and tribulations befall us as we try to find our own path through our journey of life. We can rejoice in Hope because God is with us and the power of the Holy Spirit can lift us to heights that we could never dream of or imagine.

"He's the same today as yesterday, Our great unchanging friend". During the time when the Naseby Benefice does not have a Vicar, if you would like to talk to someone or need some help please do contact any one of the four Lay Ministers. For matters to do with the seven church buildings please contact the appropriate Churchwarden.

# **No Vicar = Interregnum**

#### So what NOW?

As our present incumbent departs we enter into an Interregnum as of the 1<sup>st</sup> November.

During this period the point of contact in each parish is the churchwarden. Their contact details are on the benefice website. There will be a modified pattern of services (again on the website and in this Magazine) where a visiting priest will preside at Eucharist services and our lay ministers (Readers) organise other services. Any requirements for Baptisms, Weddings or Funerals should be directed to the respective churchwarden.

#### We ADVERTISE for a new Priest.

The Peterborough Diocese will be advertising for a new incumbent and to facilitate that process each Parish is preparing a profile which will be incorporated into a Benefice profile outlining our individual churches / villages and what we see as the requirements for our new priest. If you would like to contribute to these profiles please speak to your local churchwarden or PCC member.

The advertisement will appear in the Church Times, most likely after Christmas, in which there will importantly be a link to our Benefice profile for prospective applicants to gain information.

#### We hope to get multiple APPLICATIONS.

Representatives from each Parish have been chosen and it is they that will review and interview applicants, and propose to the Bishop a chosen Priest. This might mean we get a new Vicar sometime after Easter 2023.

#### What can I do?

Interregnums should be, and usually are, a time that our church members and indeed the wider village community pull together to ensure that we maintain continuity and have great hope for the future. We look forward to everyone's thoughtful and prayerful contribution.
