

Dear Friends

Last month Valerie wrote about unity and the last days of January (18th – 25th) have been a specific period of Prayer for Christian Unity in all its aspects. May I urge all of us to continue those prayers for unity within our own parishes and this benefice, particularly the benefice as we continue in our process to seek a new inspirational incumbent who will lead us to a future that sees care and growth as a major part of our unified vision for the church across our seven parishes.

As I sit here writing this letter my Church Times calendar is in front of me and presents many events that are happening as we approach the period of Lent at the end of February. The first of these is the Presentation of Christ in the Temple or as it is perhaps better known "Candlemas" which is celebrated on the 2nd February. It is that story about Mary and Joseph conforming to Jewish custom to present their baby boy in the temple forty days after his birth. (you can read about that law in Leviticus chapter 12). That visit to the Temple in Jerusalem gives us an insight as to how God answers our prayers. There in the temple is an old man, Simeon, along with Anna. Simeon had been hanging on to the prayerful hope of God's promise that he would one day see the Messiah and here before his eyes and as he took Jesus into his arms he proclaimed Jesus as a light to the world, a light to the whole, not just Jewish, world. It is of course that imagery of Jesus as light coming into the world which is represented when we give a lit candle to the newly baptised. We too are that light in our world to overcome much of the darkness.

That thought of darkness in the world leads me back to the calendar and the 12th and 19th February where we respectively think and pray about Racial Justice and Church Action on Poverty. I say think and pray but there is much more we can do in practical ways to help both these causes and it is therefore important to know more about the challenges that individuals caught up in racial justice and/or poverty face. As Jesus, sometimes referred to as Rabboni (meaning **teacher**) spoke with his disciples (meaning **learner**) so we too need to gather together, to learn together, to raise questions together using the bible as our teacher. We do this in our home groups but importantly we now have Café Church in Welford and Clipston where we meet together for breakfast on a Sunday morning and then discuss together a particular topic and we learn so much both about the topic and each other. We seriously invite you to come along as we learn together in **unity** – all are most welcome.
