
Christmas Community Boxes

Very sadly, Jean died in Kettering Hospital after



Commentary

2022 comes to a close with a very cold, dry December, with just 48.7mm of rain in the month against a long term average of 67mm for a typical December.

This means that for the whole year 2022 finishes around 90mm below the long term annual average - we'd typically see around 710mm per year, but 2022 came in at 621mm. It may have felt especially dry in 2022 because we experienced three very wet years in 2019-2021, with an average of 888mm over those three years.

Nature Notes

Well, here we are, well into a new year and the weather is as strange as ever! We go from unseasonably warm to very wet or much colder than we've been for years. I love the sunny winter days, and the sunsets behind the bare silhouettes of trees, but the converse seems to be days and days of overcast gloom, which is enough to make anyone want to hibernate. Some of the January bright frosty mornings have been spectacular, a black and white world with our silver birch tree graceful in the stillness.

It's all very well getting all poetic. I've just been digging leeks and carrots for tomorrow's lunch and can hardly feel my fingers, and I well remember when we had ewes waiting to lamb in the poly tunnel in the paddock. The water troughs used to freeze and it was often a mornings work with the hair dryer or jugs of hot water to get the water flowing again, and many farmers must have been having that problem quite a lot this winter.

Most of the fields are clear of stock now. It's a time to check the hedges, fences and ditches, and collect firewood to season for future years.

Meanwhile nature seems to be waiting. We do have some snowdrops in bloom - the large variety with broad grey leaves. Daffodil leaves are also standing proud. We're thinking of planting broad beans soon, and hoping that the new fruit trees we've planted will be ok. We lost a pear tree we planted last winter despite regular watering. A great many saplings planted with hope for the future of the planet didn't survive the hot dry summer. It's not just a case of plant a tree and watch it grow, they need water and keeping free of weeds while they get established. The bumper crop of apples from our older trees has lasted well, 6 eating apples left and still cookers and blackberries in the freezer. By the next Bugle spring will be advancing fast. An annual glory to look forward to!

Excerpts from The Eulogy of the late Valerie Read; 12th February 1940 – 27th October 2022

+

Valerie Read (nee Howes) was born on Monday 12th February 1940. At No 1 Easenhall Road, Harborough Magna to parents Frank and Florence ('Betty') Margaret Howes.

Frank and Betty made the decision to christen mum 'Valerie', with 2 days to go to Valentine's Day (the saint of love). She was the third of five children. Her siblings being Melvyn, Thelma, Anne and Tony. Both Tony and Thelma are with us today.

A happy carefree young girl, living in a village community, surrounded by countryside, a humble home (i.e. pigs in the garden, a part time 'Offy' and outside 'thunderbox') but with a loving mother and father, sisters and brothers and village friends for company. She must have been a happy young girl in Harborough Magna, However, life at this time was not at all easy for common folk.

The Second World War ended in 1945, but with food rationing, not much money and general hardship was taking its toll and life had plenty of challenges for many families.

Many serious diseases were in evidence as a result of these struggles. Mum's mother, Betty, was sadly taken into hospital with T.B. and Mum, Val, also was stricken with T.B. Ultimately, they both ended up in the same hospital in adjacent wards, where they would write letters to each other as inter ward visiting was not allowed. Many letters over the weeks and months were sent, until sadly one day, no letter was received from her mother and Valerie was told by the nurses that her mother had passed away. Mum was barely 10 years of age at this time. How she overcame this loss, we will never know, and we don't think that anybody ever would truly come to terms with such a terrible loss. The letters were kept by our Mother Val, we have found them all, lovingly stored in a little used draw at the family home.

After a further year of recuperation in Edward VII Sanitorium, in Hatton, Warwickshire. Mum was able to return home to her father, brothers and sisters and back to school with her friends.

Frank her father soon realised that he was not going to cope with rearing all 5 children on his own and so a difficult decision was made for young sister Anne to stay with Aunt Maude in nearby Wolston, at 'The Derry', whilst Mum, sister Thelma and Tony, would stay with their father in Harborough Magna. Older brother Melvin on a farm, working the land.

Mum attended Rugby High School for girls, making many life-long friends, whom she kept in touch with throughout her life. Some came along to her funeral, getting lost on the way but luckily making it in time for the wake reception!

In 1959, Mum entered and won Holiday Princess of the Week at Butlins Metropol Hotel in Blackpool, where she was holidaying at the time. Yes, she was treading the Strictly Come Dancing floorboards at the tender age of 19. She went on to the area finals which had a coveted grand prize of £1,000, which was some serious money back in 1959!

On entering the competition, she was given lessons on modelling for catwalk and photos; One foot placed at 90 degrees in front of the rear foot, with back straight, Chin up, big smile and work those shoulders! This advice was always put to good use and evident in virtually every photograph that she appeared in, from that time onwards. Indeed since Mums passing the family have been touched by kind comments from villagers and folk that knew her, many have said how Mum was always *very well turned out*, always neatly dressed, coiffured, polite and pleasant in conversation. Given the above one could say perhaps she was being taught very early on!

The early days of employment for Mum were at GEC in Rugby, where she was a Comptometer Operator in the Wages Department. A Comptometer being one of the first mechanical, manual calculators, similar to a typewriter, but with numerical keys. Mum was a popular office girl and made many lifelong friends. Mum enjoyed working and bringing home a salary that enabled fabrics to be bought, and Mum picked up the skills to become a good dress maker. There was still a lot of "make do and mend" in those days mind, but she would buy, where she was able, the fashionable clothes of the day or indeed style her own, sometimes starching the underskirts to create that fashionable full skirt volume that was popular at the dawn of the Rock and Roll era.

The fact that Rock n' Roll was now over here, and Britain was building back from the war, things were on the 'up' and Mum was part of that exciting time, and life at the age of 19 was good, she and friends even went to see Bill Haley and his Comets at Hinkley, walking part way there as their car broke down.

It was in the New Years' Eve of 1959, that mum had been invited to a New Years' Eve party. Also attending this party would be a young man from Fulham, London, who was up working in the Coventry area, selling National Cash Registers to pretty well anyone who wanted to buy one! His name was Michael Read (Dad). He was going to be Mum's blind date for the evening, it was love at first sight and they married less than a year later on the 10th December 1960.

Initially they rented a flat in Coventry, then mortgaged their first house in Ullswater Road, Binley, Coventry. It was here that we three children were born. Myself, Jonathan (now in Brixworth) and Julia (now in Minnesota USA). It was not long before they realised that these were going to be tall children and they were going to need a bigger house!

Valerie Read Eulogy Continued ...

In 1970 the family found a new build house (Cippenham Builders Ltd), 33, The Leys ('Newland Park' on the original house documents!) in Welford, after a tip off from a Warren Marshall. Warren ran a garage on the A45 near Coventry, where Dad used to call in for petrol and car maintenance on his Ford Anglia. Warren and his wife Jean became good friends and latterly the good neighbours at number 34 moving in around the same time, just next door. Through Annette (now Kingston) their surviving daughter, there is still family connection. Mandy Marshall, their youngest daughter was killed in a tragic car accident some years ago.

As The Leys was being built and new people were moving in. There was a shared need for making friends and reaching out and helping each other. Many friendships were borne, through children, schooling, Church and village activities. Friendships that still endure to this day through Julie Cromack, Jean Tucker, and so many local families that we have the privilege to know.

It was around this time that Mum and Jean Tucker set up the Tufty Club (Tufty was a squirrel that was a nationwide symbol for RoSPA, for children's road safety at that time). A float with many children on was entered into the Welford Carnival. The children dressed as either Tufty, Mrs Fluffy tail, Bobbie Brown Rabbit, or Policeman Badger. We have found photos of the youngsters dressed as these characters, some by now must hold high office positions and so the photos must be worth a ransom fortune!

Mum was also a member of the local W.I. Taking it in turn, with other members, to make cakes for their meetings. Her cream sponge cake was always a winner. She thoroughly



enjoyed the company of the local members and taking part in the competitions and raffles, she found the various presentations enlightening and would often talk about them. The WI gave her a warm feeling of community and a welcome focal point in her calendar, The Welford WI should be congratulated on the accomplishments warmth and solidarity.

It was with great sadness that, as a family, we saw mum's decline in her later years. This was partially due to the Vascular Dementia that was diagnosed some 3 years ago. This disease unfortunately slowly robbed Mum of her independence and dulled the shine of someone who all through her life had sparkled so brightly for us all.

We as her family supported her during this difficult time, to make sure that she was able to stay in her own home for as long as possible; Julia spent the last two summers over from USA with Mum. Supporting her and taking her out and away to holidays in Devon, to give Mum the best quality of life possible. Indeed, this last long very warm summer, must have been, we hope, a truly lovely summer for Mum. Certainly, it was a summer that Mum was able to enjoy, with family, and she was still living in her own beloved home and surrounding garden.

Mum's health unfortunately declined after a fall down stairs and she spent the last few weeks of her life, at Anya Court Care Home in Rugby, the care and compassion from the team there were very evident. Mum passed away peacefully with members of her family around her on the eve of the 27th October 2022. Mum Val will always be remembered with great affection and love.

The whole Read Family would like to thank the friends and community of Welford for their kindness and support over these recent difficult months.

That is without the intense pressure of trying to perform in the ice cold cauldron of one of Welford's two golfing championships. In his presentation speech, organiser John Nicholas admitted he struggled out there.

He was not the only one. Guest competitor Crispin Jolly who travelled up specially from London the day before came last - not surprisingly in only his third ever round - but escaped picking up the booby prize. Yes, shock horror, Mr Blobby has gone missing.

The family prize was won by father and son Derek and Graham Bott. They should have taken home a golfing print but that too is mysteriously AWOL.

A former winner of the ignominious Mr Blobby trophy, Sheila Scullion, went from zero to hero in lifting the ladies' prize.

...... Breaking news! Mr Blobby has been found (shame!) as has the golfing print!

Russell Bott has written to the Bugle asking if anyone can shed light on these 2 photographs.

He writes, "As a family we lived in Rugby but on many Sundays dad would take us on walks around the reservoir or the surrounding area, pointing out all the flora and fauna and tales of his young years in Welford. We'd often finish up watching the gliders (on the airfield where he delivered papers to the servicemen during the war).

My dad passed away in 1995 but Welford will always be a special place for us and we still walk around the reservoir and down Hall Lane and remember the often told stories"

Russell Bott's father was Edwin (Eddie) and lived at 1 The Square during the war with his dad (John) and mum

(Gertrude) and sisters (Betty and Ruth). His great-grandfather was Edwin Bott and as far as Russel knows he, and probably previous generations lived at 'Bott's Lodge' which was down Hall Lane. There's no trace of the building now but he remembers seeing the part ruined building as a lad and thanks to a chance visit to the Historical Society exhibition a few years ago managed to find the site again.

In the football photo (1919-1920) there may have been some of Russell's relatives, John Bott (Grandfather, 15 at the time), great grand-father (Edwin 55)

Or possibly great uncles Joseph (34), Arthur (22) and Ernest (19).

Into the quarter finals

At the time of writing, we are awaiting the draw for the quarter final of the Northamptonshire FA County Cup, which will feature Welford Victoria's Saturday Adults team following a superb 4-1 win at Woodford United. That team remains unbeaten this season, raising hopes of a first trophy at Newlands Road since 2011.

125 years of WVFC

2023 will, at some point, mark 125 years of football in Welford. We can't be sure exactly when that year the club was formed, but this newspaper report of a game played on Boxing Day in 1898 is the earliest record we have, kindly shared with us by the Welford and Sulby Historical Society. WELFORD v. KETTERING ST. MARY'S. On Boxing Day a match was played between Welford and Kettering St. Mary's Club, resulting in a win for the former. In the evening the members held their annual dance in the National School, when a large number attended.

In 1999, as many of you may well remember, a game was played against a team of Leicester City All-Stars to celebrate the centenary of the club. The game, part of a day-long festival of football, helped the club raise £2,400 for Imperial Cancer Research and the British Heart Foundation. As it seems it all began right at the end of 1898, meaning the centenary was marked in 1999, the current committee and managers will have to decide whether to celebrate in 2023, 2024 or both!

In amongst the treasure trove shared with us by the Historical Society was this picture of a WVFC Reserve side from the 1921/22 season. We couldn't resist putting it alongside our Colts team, photographed about 100 years later!
