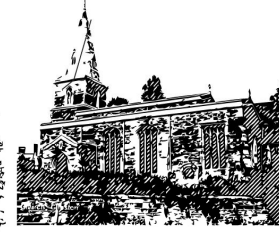

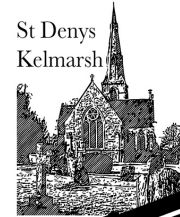

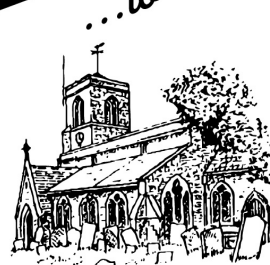

Celebrating the Power of Music in the Church

What will you remember most about the Coronation Service?

Will it be the lavish outfits of the royals, the pomp and ceremony of the event as whole or perhaps, the mysterious and solemn elements of the coronation of the King himself? For many people I have spoken to, the aspect of the service they most appreciated was the music. The whole event seemed an extravaganza of different kinds from the sung liturgy, the late Queen's favourite hymn "Praise My Soul the King of heaven" to the imposing grandeur of Handel's Zadok the Priest".

Music is not just important for such major events as 'the Coronation' but is key to much of our local parish worship.

There are many examples of the importance of music in worship throughout the Bible. In the Old Testament book of 1. Chronicles 13.8 we are told that "David and all the Israelites celebrated before God with all their might, with songs and on harps and lyres, with tambourines, cymbals, and trumpets".

In Matthew's account of the Last Supper, we read that after the meal, Jesus and the disciples sang a Psalm praising God and asking for His protection.

Paul, also entreated the early Christians in Ephesus to "Speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

So why has music in worship remained so important to this day? Many would agree that music speaks to us at an emotional level. Songs of celebration may lead us to dance. Songs of lament may lead us to tears. Music has a way of piercing into the deepest parts of our soul, and in a way that assists our expression and response to God and to the Church.

Hymns and other Christian songs can give us theology through their lyrics which are full of rich, theological text. This can help us to learn and to grow in faith as we sing them week by week. Martin Luther and John and Charles Wesley clearly understood the teaching function of hymns and how one based soundly on scripture can be worth any number of less well targeted sermons!

Since the earliest days of the Christian Church and, in fact even before then, we have been called to sing hymns of praise as a way of demonstrating our joy in collective worship.

It is a wonderful gift that we are all called to sing – however musical (or not) we may be. It is also wonderful that through our worship we can ‘make music’ in our hearts, thanking God for everything he gives us, including the gift of our Church and the power of music in all its many forms.
