The season is literally springing into summer. Flowers are buds one day and full bloom the next. I have been surprised by overnight Irises in wonderful colours, roses, like June, busting out all over, and the May blossom and cow parsley on the roadsides is a glory to behold. Peonies next. Carpets of dandelions glowed golden on the roadsides before a mist of spherical downy seed heads appeared, waiting to be blown away. This is the very peak of the year in nature, and it seems in a great hurry to put on a stunning display.


The sheep are now being shorn, looking strangely thin and naked, but no doubt relieved to be free of their winter wool. The trouble is their lambs take a while to recognise them. I just wish we made better use of this product. The wealth of the country was built on it at one time and now it's hardly worth the cost of shearing - which is a very skilled task, and very hard work.

Bird life has been very busy. We have several local blackbird families, and they are perpetually looking for food for their young, but still find time to sing so beautifully one has to pause and appreciate the exquisite sound. I did finally see a wren, in fact two wrens doing a courtship display with their tiny tails displayed like miniature peacocks. That was a sight rarely seen. There has also been a wagtail bobbing about to add to the list from the last Bugle, and the swallows are here. Not many of them, but enough to delight my eyes with their distinctive flight. I hope they are finding enough flies, but our newly renovated pond should help. My younger granddaughter found some minute wriggly red threadlike creatures swimming about, thousands of them! We looked them up on the ever useful internet and discovered they are the Aquatic Larvae of the non biting midge. So glad they are non biting!

The vegetable garden is well under control with a feast of asparagus now and many other goodies to come. As I write this in a dry time I just hope there will be enough gentle showers to keep everything growing.

SOME WELFORD STREET NAMES

If you had come along the Portway, along Bakehouse Lane Road into Bakehouse Lane leaving Overtownsend Street on your left, walked down Bakehouse Lane to the top of Grange Street and looked to your right, what would you be looking at?

You would be standing by the Churchyard gate looking at the west end of the Church; you came along the A50 from Portly Ford by the Hoveringham Cuarries; this road was called the Portway in 1284 and for how many centuries before and after we do not know. Bakehouse Lane Road, which we know better as Newlands was newly made in 1778 after the Enclosure Award; it cut across the Middle Field which, that year, with the Hemploe Field and the Abbey Field, was divided into the smaller fields we know today.

Overtownsend Street was the name of the top end of West End in the 1660s - for how much longer I have yet to find out. West End was known as Bakehouse Lane in and before 1777: The Bakehouse was where Mr. & Mrs. Hetzel now live. Eventually, when the name West End was adopted, Bakehouse Lane was used for the present Newlands Road - easier on the tongue than Bakehouse Lane Road.

Newcomers to Welford soon learn that though we have an officially named 'West Street' to most of us it is known as 'The Back Street'. It was called the Back Street in 1718 but at that time its alternative name was Grange Street.

There is a lot of interesting research to be done into the history of the Grange - not the present Grange on the Naseby Road where Mr. & Mrs. R.F. Thomas live, but possibly our present Manor.




