# **Notes from your Parish Council**

- The Parish Council has agreed to install three new street lights in the village. Two will be located at the north end of the High Street outside the Pocket Park, these will light up that area for people walking to/ from the canal and The Wharf and also provide light within the Pocket Park
- thas been reported that there are some dog owners still not clearing up after their dog has pooped. This is particularly noticeable within the Playing Field and is unhealthy for users. Under the Public Spaces Protection Order issued by WNC, dog owners and all persons in control of a dog on land to which this Order applies must have with them an appropriate means to pick up dog faeces deposited by that dog
- A white line has been painted at the entrance to the Playing Field in West End. This is to remind motorists not to park their vehicle there and leave the gates accessible in case of emergency
- If you have an issue in relation to potholes, loose paving, overgrown vegetation on roads and footopaths and you do not have access to the internet, WNC Street Doctor can be contacted between 9.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Friday on 0300 126 7000. If you have access to the internet, there is a link on the front page of the village website which enables you to make an online report using a map so that the precise location of the problem can be highlighted to WNC Highways





We were delighted to welcome over 450 visitors to Welford Youth and Community Centre and adjacent Playing Field on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> June for our second ever KidsFest. With over 26 stalls and different activities for the children to enjoy, we really hope there was something for everyone. Based on the feedback we've received, those attending particularly loved the smoothie bike (again), but also really enjoyed Wormologist Anna's talk about worms and why they're vital to support our eco-system. Lots of the children enjoyed building a wormery to take home, and there's even one at Welford Pre-school and another at Welford, Sibbertoft and Sulby Endowed School. The worms are thriving on food scraps and the children will harvest the worm tea when it's ready to help feed the plants they are growing.

The event was free of charge for all to attend, and this was made possible from funding obtained through West Northants Council. 

### **Nature Notes**

What a wet time. We're on top of a hill, and water has flowed down our yard like a river in spate. No wonder floods can overwhelm so quickly. Luckily ours ends up in the brook at the bottom of the paddock and flows on into the Avon, but those downstream are often less fortunate. The upside is that I haven't had to do too much watering. The downside is prolific weeds and extra lawn mowing when the weather relents. There are however compensatory moments, when the sun comes out and I can sit with a coffee, neglecting my book and just enjoying the surrounding garden and fields.

Someone at the bottom of the village was excited to tell me that he has seen two green woodpeckers at the same time in his garden. They have now paid us a visit, and spent a long time invading the ants nests that seem unusually numerous - about 10 on the top lawn.

The buddleia is in flower and this always means butterfly time. When it is dry I have seen peacocks, red admirals, painted ladies and many cabbage whites. The brassicas are all safely netted from their depravations. Over the grass and the raspberry canes there are lots of meadow browns and the occasional flash of colour from a common blue, also bright red and black cinnabar moths, and lots little white fluttery ones which are all over the thistles in the fields. Large hawk moths take refuge in our porch. In fact the bug population seems to be thriving in this small corner - not to mention the spiders and flies which seem determined to take up residence in the house!

The vegetable patch is providing well - the next treat is the first runner beans with lamb and mint sauce. I also planted 138 leeks - there are a lot of seeds in a packet!

Let's hope for some settled sunshine, but be careful what we wish for, not 40 degrees again please.

During the meeting it was mentioned that Welford Village Hall could be the oldest in Northamptonshire. Other halls may be older, but these tend to be Church halls and Reading rooms etc. The original building in Welford dates back to 1905.



Frances Harris writes "I recently had the pleasure of visiting Welford Village Hall to deliver trustee roles training to the hall's committee. I was given an incredibly warm welcome and, after completing the training, enjoyed a tour of the


handsome building.

This very wellsupported and run hall, which was built in 1905, sits in the centre of the village of Welford in the northwest of the

County, close to the Leicestershire border. Serving a village community of just over 1,000, the building has a main hall, generous sized meeting room, modern kitchen and a parking area to the side.

The main hall can accommodate up to 100 people and, with the Billiard Room, another 40. Facilities include a kitchen, disabled toilet, babychanging and, since 2021, Wifi.

The committee took the decision to install wifi in part to offset the difficulties created by Covid and to help encourage the return of user groups as restrictions were gradually eased. In June of that year, the WI

# WELFORD VILLAGE HALL NEWS CONT.

At the opposite end of the main hall is a memorial tablet which records a gift of £797 by the residents of Welford to Northampton General Hospital's WW2 war memorial appeal. This would have been a very substantial sum at the time, equivalent to around £27,800 today, so this was an act of great generosity on the part of the people of Welford.
