

Dear friends

We have recently been fortunate to visit Northumberland for a few days to celebrate our eldest son's birthday as well as the birthday of his eldest child. But I must own up to having my days filled with snuggles and cuddles from our youngest grandchild Izack, who is just three months old. In the hours that I was blessed to be able to hold him, as I gazed on his dark eyelashes as he slept and murmured in his sleep, I meditated on the role of Christian grandparents, as indicated in the Scriptures. We have a unique role in passing down spiritual values and beliefs to the next generation. We have an opportunity to teach our grandchildren about God's love and faithfulness, and our experiences can serve as a testimony to the younger generations. From Psalm 78 verses 4-7 we read "We will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD, his power, and the wonders he has done. 5 He decreed statutes for Jacob and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our ancestors to teach their children, ⁶ so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children. ⁷Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands." This quotation is very clear that grandparents are responsible for telling not only their own children but the next generation about the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done. Family worship is one means of introducing children to the truths of Scripture and preparing children for a Christ centred life, as well as surrounding them with a Church family; perhaps you could consider it a task you could take on as grandparents to bring your own grandchildren to family worship, even if their parents don't choose to attend (if they live close enough).

However, some children are not blessed with grandparents when they are born or during their formative years, but that is no reason for Christians not to "adopt" the role of a "local grandparent". We live 250 miles from 4 of our grandchildren and 10 miles from the other one for whom we offer child care at least one day a week, so we need to find different ways to fulfil our Christian grandparent roles to the ones we are not able to see frequently. But even if grandchildren live in another country, technology allows us to read from a children's Bible the stories which tell of the followers of God and Jesus, and a Christmas or birthday gift of the same copy that you use would enable them to follow the story as you read when they are old enough.

Finally, there is the great ability to pray for each child on a daily basis and commit them to the love of our heavenly Father, and from those prayers you will have something to tell them every time you communicate — I love you, God loves you and when I speak to Him every day, I ask Him to watch over you and bless you with His love, care and compassion. Especially for any grandparents for whom the route of communication with their grandchildren is broken; your prayer is most valuable.

In the UK in 2023 the 1st October is designated as Grandparent day, perhaps you might like on that day to pray for your grand-children – let's flood the area of Naseby Group with prayers for our grandchildren (and those we might have adopted as local grandparent figures.)
