

WELFORD in HARMONY

The recent Welford in Harmony concert held on 10th December 2023 in Welford Congregational Chapel raised the sum of £453.22. The Members of the Choir would like to thank all those who attended and who gave so very generously to enable us to split the sum between our two chosen Charities, the Chapel itself and the Springbridge Driving for the Disabled Group.

We are most grateful to the Chapel for allowing us to hold our weekly rehearsals in their lovely building with its excellent acoustics and to Lynne and Rachel who helped with the refreshments following the Concert..

Some of you may not know what Springbridge do, they are a purpose built complex based in Willoughby Waterleys which is run by two couples who devote themselves to giving those with disabilities the opportunity to drive a carriage, which can take a wheelchair if necessary, around the countryside. All the ponies and the carriages have been passed as fit for purpose by the governing body, Riding for Disabled (RDA) as have those who accompany them in the carriage. Currently there are about 6 ponies qualified under the RDA and there are other retired ponies who live in great luxury after having given years of service. Facilities include a large outdoor school, a covered walker so the ponies can be exercised if the weather is inclement, a comfortable club room with a kitchen and views over the fields and in the summer, outdoor seating with planters ablaze with flowers.

I first came to know of the group just over 20 years ago when my son died abroad in an accident. At the time he was working for BP and they gave a substantial sum in his memory. Patrick had always loved driving his pony and in his university holidays used to help at another Group, so hearing that Springbridge were seeking to start up a group and improve their facilities, the money went to them and the Clubroom has a plaque in his memory. HRH The Princess Royal formally opened the premises on 6th June 2005. Since then I have gone weekly when possible to help clean the harness. Springbridge is always pleased to see visitors so if anyone would like to visit them (bring your children as well) please contact me and I will be pleased to give you a guided tour. Perhaps wait until the summer so you can enjoy the flowers!

An Update from Welford Guides: February 2024

Since the last round-up in October's Bugle, Welford Guides have continued to have lots of fun, all whilst building friendships, developing confidence, self-belief and team-work skills. Some highlights from most recent months include:

- Learning about binary code and making bracelets containing cryptic binary messages

- A Halloween party, with fun activities such as apple bobbing, eating donuts from a string without using hands and the classic chocolate on a plate game!

- Making and decorating Christmas ornaments with wonderful local potter, Lisa

- Making dioramas depicting scenes from the Nativity for entry in the competition organised by Church

- A Christmas party with plenty of festive food and some party games

- An ice skating trip at Whilton Locks Garden Village

One of the most important activities that the girls took part in before Christmas was the distribution of over 40 Community Christmas Boxes. Together with two parent helpers (and one leader who had the cushy job of transporting the boxes in the car!) ten Guides spent an afternoon walking around the village in chilly, drizzly weather, delivering boxes of festive goodies to those who had been nominated. The girls did a brilliant job and we're so proud of them for giving up their free time to help out in the local community. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who contributed a box.

The new year has gotten off to a flying start with girls exploring the mechanics of keyhole surgery in our very first meeting of 2024. The girls were tasked with designing and creating an implement to retrieve a very small item from a cardboard box with two small holes cut into it: one through which to insert the implement, and the other through which to shine a light. They rose to the challenge and all groups successfully retrieved the item!

On Monday 15th January we welcomed Hilary Hunt from Trees for Welford and the girls took part in an informative workshop concerning the plans for tree planting within the village. They played the role of 'Tree Time Travellers' and considered where best to plant trees in order to protect the 'Guides of the Future' from the inevitable effects of the climate crisis we are facing.

The girls have many more fun activities planned this term, including exploring the science of baking and a trip to Flipout trampoline park at the end of March with other Guides from across the county.

In January, over 80 youngsters discussed, played games, shared their knowledge about trees and climate change, and created designs to plant trees on the Playing Field. Welford Explorers, Scouts, Guides, Cubs, Brownies and Rainbows all actively participated in the consultations Trees for Welford held for them during their meetings at the Youth and Community

Centre. All these youngsters regularly use the Playing Field for a few hours a week as groups, as part of their Scouting / Guiding activities. We challenged them to become Tree Time Travellers and imagine themselves in 50 years 'time – they all had a coloured hat to wear, to help this transformation. Their task was to design a tree-planting scheme based on our professional arboriculturist's proposals, to transform the Playing Field into a space fit for Scouting and Guiding outdoor activities in 50 years when our weather will have become hotter, drier, wetter and stormier.

We have presented their ideas to the Parish Council, as part of the full evaluation of last November's consultation on planting trees in Welford's few spaces accessible by the public.

Well, I think we can all agree that we saw considerable rain in the latter part of 2023 - December was the second wettest on the records we have. With December being exceptionally wet (110.7mm versus an average of 69.1mm), and 2023 being above average until then, the whole year ended well above average with 804.5mm of rain for the year against an annual average of 714.6mm. The rolling averages for the previous 4 and 10 year periods now show a marked up-tick in October and December rain levels compared to 'all-time' averages - we've had wetter ends to years.

Nature Notes

Where are we in the year you might ask. We've had floods and frosts, dreary dull days and glorious bright sunny ones, ferocious winds and calm, peaceful interludes, and temperatures have varied widely too. Nature doesn't know where it is! Wallflowers have been unseasonably in flower, and all the usual spring flowers are blooming early, aconites are shining yellow, little cyclamen, daffodils in fat bud, crocuses and hellebores, all cheering a walk round the garden. Someone mentioned possible blizzards in February so maybe they've all taken the wrong cues from conditions.

As I write we are approaching Candlemas day, the 2nd February, a day that marks the return of light. The Christian festival commemorates the presentation of Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem, referring to him as the light of the people of Israel. It is traditionally the 40th day of, and the conclusion of the Christmas-Epiphany Season. Some people leave their Christmas trees up until Candlemas. The days definitely are getting noticeably lighter both morning and evening. The flower that symbolises this festival is the snowdrop, and of course these are gracing our gardens at the moment. Studied closely the buds of snowdrops, like candle flames, can resemble hands clasped in prayer, making them a vey appropriate symbol for this festival.

The winds have taken their toll. Garden fences have suffered, but a walk in the Hemploe woods shows just how many branches and trees have fallen. Even so, among the debris the occasional tiny bluebell leaf is appearing, a promise of glories to come.

It's the time of year of the Great British Bird count, and I have been watching the feeders and the skies. Lots of blue, long tailed and coal tits, robins, sparrows, wrens, blackbirds, jackdaws, pigeons, the occasional magpie and sailing the skies pairs of red kites. Nothing particularly unusual. I have seen field fares locally, though these are less numerous than usual. So many hedges are neatly trimmed, opening up the view, but depriving the birds of berries and shelter.

The fields and lanes have been very squelchy. Every time it dries up a little we get more rain, hiding the potholes and muddying the verges. Let's hope that February fill dyke doesn't live up to it's name and we can start to garden in earnest in the coming weeks.

Harborough Woodland Community Volunteers (HW)

South Leicestershire has a woodland coverage of 3 – 4% (Surrey's is 25%) and it is decreasing with Ash dieback. Harborough Woodland is a not for profit community group set up in February 2020. It's aim is to increase woodland cover by planting trees and hedgerows and to reduce the risk of flooding through natural flood management (NFM). NFM schemes use vast numbers of trees and hedges. The roots, soil and fungi of one metre of mature hedge is a live sponge that can hold and slowly release 3 to 5m3 or tonnes of potential flood water (hedgelink.org.uk) Since February 2020 the group has:

- Planted trees and hedgerows at 30 sites over including schools, farms, private landowners, community reserves and pub gardens;
- Planted 34,000 trees equivalent to about 7 kms of hedgerows;
- Given 20 presentations to community and charity groups;
- Instigated 12 large area natural flood management schemes;
- Won three national environment awards, Coronation Champion, Leicestershire Award (Community Environment Project) and River Champion.

Over 400 volunteers have taken part in the planting, including individuals, families, school groups, Scouts and Guides groups. The "Greener Schools Group" set up through HW is supported by 30 schools, both primary and secondary, where over 600 trees were planted in December 2022 at no cost to the schools.



Events planned for 2023/24 include plantings at: Shoulder of Mutton in Foxton; Welham Lane (2 events); Belton in Rutland; Welford; Great Bowden farm; Primary schools/academies including Meadowdale, Lubenham and C of E on Fairfield Road. 
